

Eco Council



Our newly formed Eco Council meet every Wednesday lunchtime in A1. We are proud to announce that we have signed up Court Fields School to work with Terracycle and act as an official collector in Wellington for biscuit, cake and cracker wrappers (any brand) and also for old toothpastes, toothbrushes



and their packaging. You will find the boxes in the front porch in A block along with details of acceptable waste. Terracycle is a worldwide organisation that takes difficult to recycle plastic, transforms it into pellets to reuse them into other products and avoid sending them to landfill. When we emptied Delphi the dolphin we were very pleased to see that students had been putting their non-recyclable waste in there, particularly crisp packets. Mrs Morcom who jointly runs the Eco Council has set up a swing bin in the front porch for crisp packets which will also be sent to Terracycle (eligible charity to be confirmed). Please do bring along your acceptable waste and place them in the relevant bins.

COMING SOON We will be the official collector for Kinder products including Kinder flexible plastic packaging, Kinder chocolate wrappers, Kinder aluminium foil packaging and Kinder rigid plastic packaging (including the yellow internal egg yolk).
