Year 11 Exam Information for January 2020

Please be aware that from Friday 10th to Friday 17th January we will be temporarily moving our lunch break in order to accommodate our Year 11 PPE exams. Pre-Public Exams ("mocks") 13/01/20-17/01/20

Year 11 students will be taking PPEs in January. Exams will be taken in option blocks which means that there will be more than one sitting for most exams. Students will be given an individual timetable which they need to check carefully. A few students may have clashes due to subject combinations, which will be resolved with them individually. Where students do not have exams they will be expected to be in lessons as normal.
