ART & DESIGN at Court Fields

Welcome to Art & Design!

Year 7 Overview

During Year 7, students learn and develop skills across the three basic disciplines. These include print, pencil and print. We explore the different media and materials, and develop confidence in using them. Students will have one hour a week of Art lessons where we will practise and experiment with different media and produce excellent final pieces.



Printing

In our printing unit we look at cultural prints from around the world. Students have the opportunity to develop their own response through effective research and planning.



The Drawing Project

This project runs for approximately 6 weeks and gives students techniques and skills in pencil sketching, shading and mark-making. We look at how we blend coloured pencils and how we use tone in all media to develop a sense of 3D. Students choose the technique they wish to use to allow some ownership over their own progress

The Painting Project

Based on the artist Julian Opie we learn how to effectively mix colour and apply paint in a particular style. We look in depth at how other artists work and develop our skills in writing a justified and informed opinion.





COMPUTING at Court Fields

The Computing Department

The Computing curriculum has developed at a fast pace over the last few years as technology has moved forward and allowed us to investigate new and exciting areas of development.

In Key Stage 3 the syllabus allows students to experience a range of programs and gain experience of the ways in which computers can be used. Programs such as Scratch and Python programming are used in combination with more software based projects to edit music, design websites and create movies and animations.


In Key Stage 4 we currently offer 2 courses in Creative Imedia and Computer Science.

The Creative Imedia course is more software based, looking at using programs to manipulate information and problem solve.


The Computer Science course looks at how and why computers work the way they do, focussing on software development and programming.

Lesson Focus

The Focus at Key Stage Three is on a spiral curriculum which each year adds Drama Skills and knowledge about different kinds of Drama and Theatre to students' understanding of the medium as a whole.

We aim to develop effective group work skills and analytical and evaluative skills, recognising that these are equally important as the acquisition of skills and knowledge in Drama and Theatre.





Each year, students complete a scheme of work on: Devised Drama; Scripted Drama; Process Drama; Social Themes; The History of Theatre; Theatre from other Cultures.

Extra-Curricular Activities

We have many fantastic opportunities available for young people who want to pursue Drama at Court Fields. During 2020/2021 we will be putting on a production of Oliver and we will see the return of the successful Whodunnit? in the summer.

Lesson Focus

The Technology curriculum has changed significantly in recent years as we aim to prepare students for life in an ever-changing technological world. Projects range from core skills working with wood, metal and polymers to Computer-Aided-Design and Manufacture. New and Emerging Technologies are also a taught in all areas

Food Technology has a stronger focus on nutrition and the Science behind the food we eat, core skills are also developed with a focus on understanding what is a healthy, balanced diet.

Our curriculum and projects at Key Stage Three are engaging and fun whilst ensuring that the students will have secured the knowledge needed to be successful when they opt for the subject at Key Stage Four.

ENGLISH at Court Fields Head of Faculty: Miss T Bruce

Welcome to English!



What can you expect in Year 7 English?

As Year 7 students you will build on the key knowledge and literacy skills you have developed at Primary School. As well as using and improving your skills in literacy and writing, you will be introduced to a range of more challenging and exciting texts and will hone your written skills, developing an innate sense of how language works.

Reading for pleasure as well as purpose will be a focus and you will be given ample opportunity to do this through the accelerated reader programme. Speaking and listening tasks will help to develop confidence and embed learning in a creative and dynamic way, as well as developing articulacy.

We also offer a range of extra-curricular activities and competitions, such as creative writing, a spelling bee, debating club and theatre trips, to help you go a little bit further with your learning.

What will you learn about?

Over the course of the year you will study three extended modules in English, all covering key skills in reading, writing and speaking and listening. The modules will bring together a range of fiction and non-fiction, linking texts through their historical and social contexts and have been especially designed to complement learning across the wider curriculum.

Shakespeare's heroes and villains Students will engage with a range of Shakespeare's plays, from The Tempest to Hamlet. Students will learn about society in Shakespeare's time and begin to tackle Shakespearian language and structure while focusing on Shakespeare's ability to create the nastiest and most evil of villains. **Victorian Literature** A trip through the wonderful world of Victorian London, considering a range of texts and genres and culminating with the study of Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* in the run up to the Christmas holidays.

The Gothic Our most popular Year 7 module! Students will read a range of gothic stories, poems and moving image texts from the 1800's right up to the present day. Students will then try out a variety of creative writing methods and eventually build their own gothic anthology, making use of all of the learning they have done across the year.

Grammar for Writing Alongside all the literature modules above, students will have weekly grammar for writing sessions. These sessions aim to build on the grammatical and literacy knowledge students have developed at primary school by applying grammar to the writing process. All students will do a range of writing for various purposes across the year and hone their skills as journalists, authors and poets.



MATHS at Court Fields Head of Faculty: Mrs E Hutchinson

Welcome to Maths!

Court Fields Maths team

On entry to Court Fields students are placed into sets based on their mathematical ability and test scores in KS2 assessments. They will be taught using a variety of strategies and resources, building on the progress made in KS2. During the first year they study all areas of Mathematics - Number, Algebra, Geometry and Measures and Statistics. Students develop a range of independent learning strategies and use peer, self and group assessment of work. We are keen to develop students' abilities to reason mathematically and work independently on problems set for them





Students are formally assessed each half term, but in addition to this they will have informal assessments in class and through the use of homework on Hegarty Maths. The assessments are designed to simulate the rigours of the new GCSE and encourage more problem solving and a greater depth to understanding.

We aim to encourage confidence in Mathematics for students of all abilities.

Competitions are run throughout the school to motivate and engage pupils. There are also a variety of extra-curricular activities that they can get involved with, such as looking at the application of Maths in Art, breaking cyphers and exploring problems





MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES at Court Fields Head of Faculty: Mr N Piper

Welcome to Modern Foreign Languages!

Lesson Focus

During Year 7, students take part in activities which teach them not only the basics of French and Spanish, but also key language learning skills, which will increase their competence and confidence in using a foreign language for purposes of communication. This involves the use of a wide range of resources and activities such as language games, role-play, songs, quizzes and interactive ICT tasks.




Course Content

In Year 7, students study modules of work including:

- Self, Family & Friends
- School Life

The majority of Year 7 students will study French **and** Spanish, and both languages are available as options at GCSE



<u>Assessment</u>

Progress will be assessed in 4 key skills:

- speaking
- listening
- reading
- writing

Each term students undertake a range of tasks, which mirror the assessment methods used at GCSE.





MUSIC at Court Fields Head of Faculty: Mrs S Chidgey

Welcome to Music!

Year 7 Overview

In Year 7 we look at the building blocks of Music. These include the Elements of Music, Keyboard and Guitar Skills and Instruments of the Orchestra.

Children have had a mixed Music education through primary school and it is our aim to build on that knowledge and experience. They have Music for one hour per week and are assessed against standard levels for attainment.





The Piano Project

This homework project runs alongside the Keyboard Skills unit for approximately 6 weeks and gives students basic techniques and skills in piano. Students get really creative with the projects they produce.



Elements of Music

These are the building blocks of all Music and students develop their understanding through a variety of tasks including listening, performing and composing.

The Orchestra

In this unit we look at the traditional symphony orchestra and all its tone colour. Students have the opportunity through practical sessions of exploring each orchestral family in turn.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION (PE) at Court Fields Head of Faculty: Mr J Conway

Welcome to Physical Education (PE)!

Lesson Focus

During Year 7 we ensure that all students try a variety of activities. They will cover sports such Badminton, Rugby, Netball, Football and Handball. We think it is vital that students are also aware of what is required to lead Healthy active lifestyles and how to maximise their own performance in physically demanding tasks. They will learn different ways to do this.

They will also study Gymnastics, Volleyball, Cricket, Tennis, Rounders, Softball, Dance and Fitness. Opportunities for Leadership will also be provided.





<u>Assessment</u>

All students will study a variety of concepts in PE. They will be assessed using the new 1-9 GCSE grading criteria suitable for their stage of development. To help students achieve this we will develop their skills both physically and mentally and teach them how to analyse and improve performance. Students will be constantly updated on their current grade and progress during lessons. A more formal report will be issued yearly.

Extra-Curricular Activities

We actively encourage ALL students to participate in some form of extra-curricular physical activity. Some of the clubs will be a route into playing competitive sport for the school, whilst others are organised on a more recreational basis. Either way, ALL students are ALWAYS welcome.
