#### **School Catering Information and Update**

The school previously served food from only the Dining Hall but two other temporary points have been set up in other areas of the school. This was necessary due to Covid but there were many elements to consider; how and what food could be offered, transferred, and kept warm and how to staff the additional catering points. There was significant planning and investment for this and many practical challenges to overcome.

Feedback is the best tool for improvement and we have already responded by increasing the range of food available and the amount going out to each service point, which has already seen a positive impact in this first week back. This has also increased food waste but we are continually trying to improve how this is managed.

Each day we provide a range of food options, keeping the students' favourites on the standard daily menu, e.g pasta pots and then adding in a range of variable items that we swap in and out daily, alongside a main meal such as curry, lasagne, cottage pie, for example.

The foods we serve have ingredients with a healthy twist. Low sugar and low fat ingredients, hidden vegetables in pizza based toppings and pasta sauce etc. Some drinks that we stock are 'sugar free' flavoured fizzy water and juice and is 1 portion of their 5 a day for fruit/vegetables. We also have some visibly healthy meals/snacks/fruit on offer. It is a fine balance of supply/demand and capacity but we are always trying to improve what we do.

Our action points (from our development plans and feedback) are:

- Menu to be added to school website and to the student 'What's On' guide
- Increase visible healthy options/reduce other options
- Parent tasting focus group (when Covid measures reduced/removed)
- Resume student surveys and focus groups (delayed due to Covid disruption)
- Provide regular parent updates on catering development
- Develop food pre-order system
- Wider roll-out of the National School Breakfast Programme
- Environmental plan to reduce waste and increase recycling

We hope to return to wider use of the Canteen area by mixed Year groups after Easter, but we have been supported in our decision to maintain some separation of Year groups by Public Health. They have advised that it will have been a factor in us having lower levels of positive Covid cases compared to schools who have reintroduced full mixing. Of course it is a balance, and we will ensure that we are continuing to monitor the situation over the coming weeks and months, so that we can return to our normal lunch systems as soon as it is prudent to do so.
