

## Simonside Primary School P.E. and Sports Premium 2024/25

## 2023/2024 Plan Key achievements to date:

- School Sports Mark Gold Awarded for the third year
- Participation in inter-school competitions has increased with each year participating in an event over the year.
- Achievement in intra-school competitions Boys football placing second in the league.
- More pupils joined the football club and a separate KS1 club was established - new kit for the girls team awarded through application.
- Outdoor education opportunities for Year 5 and Year 6 through a residential at Thurston.
- Assessment system is now being used to track children across separate units of sport - this is ongoing and will develop further next year.
- More opportunities given to children in line with Active60 clubs established after school and lunchtime.
- SSOC(School Sports Organising Committee) established so pupils can take the lead on improvements/initiatives/competitions - members supporting lunchtime clubs alongside SSFC coaches to support development.
- Additional swimming sessions during Summer Term for year 6 to support progress.

## Areas for further improvement in 2024/2025

- To maintain the curriculum allocation of PE lessons so each class continues to have a minimum of 2 hours of high quality P.E every week.
- To develop outdoor resources for children to access during playtimes.
- PE lead to signpost children/parents to further opportunities outside of school.
- To continue to achieve the School Sports Gold Mark Award heading towards Platinum.
- To further develop swimming skills across school ensuring an increased number of children leaving school able to swim 25 metres.
- Rolling out assessment across the school for all areas of PE (involving outside coaches in this process)
- Continued CPD for staff to increase confidence, knowledge and skills
- Build more on the role of SSOC to lead activities and promote physical activities across school.

## PE funding allocation for 2024/25 is £2500 (approximate current balance) plus £17,000 (approximate allocation)
