ATTENDANCE.

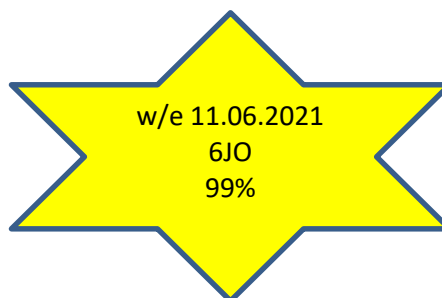
