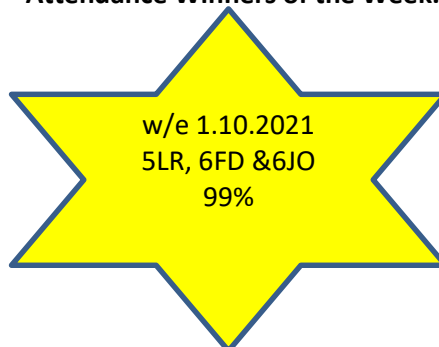
## ATTENDANCE.
