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### **Message from the Headteacher**



Dear Parent/Carer,

**Attendance:** We would like to thank parents for supporting the school in our drive to improve attendance. You will be aware that this was a key issue from our OfSTED inspection in October and so we are pleased to report that attendance improved by 0.5% across the whole school in term 2 to move attendance for the year to 94% - closer to the national average of 95%.

I would particularly like to thank parents of children in years 7 & 8. Very good attitudes to attendance in these year groups mean that the proportions of students with persistent absence (below 90% attendance) are now better than the national averages for students of the same age.

In order to support this school priority governors have recently reviewed our attendance policy, the updated policy can now be found on our website. Just a reminder to parents that the policy states that: "The school does not authorise leave of absence during term time for holidays." Thank you again for your support in building good attitudes to attendance in the school.

**Behaviour:** We constantly strive for the highest standards of behaviour at Burnside. In lessons this means students always trying their hardest and facing challenge without giving up. Around school this means showing respect and courtesy for the school and other members of the school community. We are delighted to announce a sharp fall in the number of fixed term exclusions in term 2 below the average rate nationally. This is a clear indication (along with other behaviour data) of the improving attitudes to learning in the school.

Governors recently appointed Mrs Charlotte Jenkins as Deputy Headteacher for Personal Development, Behaviour & Welfare in order to lead our continued drive on improving standards in this area.

**Parent Governors:** We currently have vacancies for three parent governors on our governing body. This is a great opportunity to be part of the strategic decision making in the school and provide valued input in how to continue to improve our school. The time commitments for this role are flexible. #### **Message from the Deputy Headteacher**



Dear Parent/Carer,

At Burnside we are always working together to ensure the climate is focused around learning, progress and success and we do this by ensuring that all students and staff follow some basic expectations which enable students to feel safe, happy and ready to learn. We recently participated in a review of the work we completed to 'Poverty Proof' our school day. It has been recognised by external partners that our policies are good and there have been no changes since September 2017. However, sometimes we all need timely reminders. In particular we are keen to ensure that all of our uniform and mobile phone policies are followed to ensure fairness and equality. We simply invite you to support us in ensuring our students are as smart and ready to learn as they can be by supporting us in ensuring consistency with these issues.

As the summer term approaches we have had many queries in regard to our uniform policy for next year and in particular the use of school issue bags for our current year 7 students. I can confirm that we share your frustrations with the quality of the bags and are investigating how we ensure that we have a better quality product. We look forward to contacting you in the near future with an update on progress and plans for September 2018 however we anticipate no significant changes in our current uniform policy.

## **Uniform Provision**

We were aware that some parents/carers encountered problems last summer purchasing school uniform from our supplier Emblematic. We carried out a survey to identify the problems and have used the findings to work with parents/carers and Emblematic to improve the service.

Firstly, there were some concerns about the quality of both polo and sweatshirts. We ran a trial using tops produced by a different uniform manufacturer provided free by Emblematic. The pilot involved parents/carers who had responded to the survey and ran from January until February half term. The response from parents/carers has been extremely positive, with regards to quality/ 'washabilty' / colouring of the sweatshirts and the polo shirts. The two products were described as 'much thicker and far superior'.

Other concerns indicated that the Emblematic shop did not have sufficient stock of the sizes required. We have assured Emblematic that there will be no change to uniform that they supply. We have also informed Emblematic of the number of students, per year group for the coming year, thus giving them the confidence to build up an adequate stock of Burnside uniform.

Parents/carers commented on problems in accessing the Emblematic shop at busy times. We have agreed that Emblematic will be present in the College during the New Intake Parents Evening on 3 July 2018 to sell uniform and to take orders for either collection or delivery.

Emblematic have also informed us of the improvements that have been made to their shop /unit increasing its size, number of tills and staff to enable them to cope with demand at the busiest times.
