- Evaluate their ideas and products against their own design criteria and consider the views of others to improve their work.


English—Persuasion (Newspaper Article)

- Identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude and the equator.
- Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/ computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.
- Locate the world's countries concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical features
- Understand types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including food.
- Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human geography of a region of the UK and a region of South America.
- Describe and understand key aspects of physical geography, including: climate zones, biomes and vegetation belts.
- Explore the effect humans can have on their environment.
