#### Implementation of RE

RE is taught primarily through a sequence of lessons following the Church of England's "Understanding Christianity" resource. All other world faiths and beliefs are taught through a collection of units that mirrors Understanding Christianity and is produced by RE specialists at the Diocese of Durham and Newcastle.
