With his trusty band of men he sets sail in search of the land where the sun goes at night - but he finds much more!</p> <p><b>Spring: King of the Cloud Forests</b> After being rescued in the mountains of Tibet by a near-human tribe who revere him as a god, Ashley must choose between returning to the violence of the village he fled and the tests of courage that await him as the tribe's god.</p> <p><b>Summer: Secrets of a Sun King</b> It's 1922, just at the point when the world was poised waiting for news about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb in Egypt, when Lil finds a mysterious package on her grandad's doorstep, just as he's struck down with a terrible illness. The parcel was sent by a famous Egyptologist who has just been found dead! Is the curse of Tutankhamun the cause?</p>	 <p><b>The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane - Kate DiCamillo</b> Edward Tulane is an impressive china rabbit. Abigail, his owner, adores and cares for him completely, but Edward does not return her love. Edward is self-centred, proud and heartless; he cares nothing for love. <b>Key Themes:</b> PSHCE focus friendship, care for others, respect, family, changing behaviour</p>	 <p><b>The Queen's Nose - Dick King Smith</b> Harmony's Uncle Ginger sends her on a treasure trail - which ends in finding a 50p piece. But this is no ordinary coin - in fact, when you rub the queen's nose, your wishes will be answered. <b>Key Themes:</b> desire, animals, fantasy and magic</p>	 <p><b>The Railway Children - E. Nesbit</b> This story centres on the lives of three children whose comfortable, middle-class existence ends when their father has to go away unexpectedly. The children leave their London home and move to a small cottage in the country where life is very different. <b>Key Themes:</b> Classic fiction on story, PSHCE focus on family and friendship &amp; facing life's challenges</p>
	 <p><b>The Butterfly Lion - Michael Morpurgo</b> A lyrical and moving tale of a young boy growing up in Africa, and his lifelong friendship with a white lion. Morpurgo sweeps from a British boarding school to the African wilds, and from the First World War to the present day. <b>Key Themes:</b> PSHCE focus on friendship and loss, including war and separation</p>	 <p><b>The Lost Words - Jackie Morris</b> An illustrated collection of spell-poems to re-wild the language of children. Countrywide, there are words disappearing from children's lives. These are the words of the natural world, to be found within this special collection. <b>Key Themes:</b> wild childhood, nature and the natural world around us</p>	 <p><b>The Boy at the Back of the Class - Onjali Rauf</b> When a new boy joins their class, a group of children try to befriend him. They soon learn that Ahmet is a refugee and has been separated from his family. None of the grown-ups seem to be able to help him, so the friends come up with a daring plan, embarking on an extraordinary adventure. <b>Key Themes:</b> Citizenship link to immigration, PSHCE link to bullying, empathy</p>
