It is a story of friendship between Bronze, a mute peasant boy, and Sunflower, the young daughter of an artist sent to a May Seventh Cadre School.	 <b>Macbeth- Shakespeare</b> Set in medieval Scotland and, Macbeth charts the bloody rise to power and tragic downfall of the warrior Macbeth. Already a successful soldier in the army of King Duncan, Macbeth is informed by Three Witches that he is to become king. <b>Key Themes:</b> play, stories from our literary heritage	 <b>Return to Wonderland - Various Authors</b> Tumble down the rabbit hole again to find out what happens in Wonderland without Alice there. 	<b>Summer: Who Let the Gods Out?</b> A troubled boy's life is turned upside down when an immortal crashes out of the sky onto his barn. They go on adventures together but accidentally release a daemon. With help from the gods, they begin a quest to save the world that takes them to incredible places on Earth and beyond.		 <b>The Barnabus Project - Eric Fan</b> In a world built for Perfect Pets, Barnabus is a Failed Project, half mouse, half elephant, kept out of sight until his dreams of freedom lead him and his misfit friends on a perilous adventure. <b>Key Themes:</b> escape, liberation, acceptance, self-love, following your dreams.
 <b>Diary of a Wimpy Kid - Jeff Kinney</b> Middle school is not an enjoyable experience for Greg but a horrid ordeal of social land-mines that he must bear. To do so, he devises schemes to win him the recognition and status he feels he deserve!
