George Frideric Handel 23 February 1685 - 14 April 1759	Traditional (Romantic) Key Song: Night on a Bare Mountain - Mussorgsky This piece tells the story of a mountain packed with creatures where evil comes out to play at midnight. The orchestral piece features four different sections - string, woodwind, brass and percussion.		Traditional (Baroque) Key Song: Hallelujah from Messiah - Handel Hallelujah from Messiah is part of an oratorio composed by Handel. The oratorio is about the saviour of humankind - a commentary on nativity, passion, resurrection and ascension.		
Handel was a German-British baroquo composer well known for his operas, oratorios and concertos. He was strongly influenced by the					Wr sound

The song contains a sample from "Oops Up Side Your Head" which can be heard during the bridge.		*Funk (1965) Key Song: I Got You (I Feel Good) - James Brown "I Got You (I Feel Good)" is a twelve-bar blues track with a brass-heavy instrumental arrangement. The song includes a prevalent alto sax and singer whose voice is soulful and powerful.
