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<u>Programmes of study / Development Matters</u>

<u>C&L</u>

- Make comments about what they have heard and ask questions to clarify their understanding.
- Hold conversation when engaged in back and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers.
- Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems when appropriate.

<u>EAD</u>

Note: In Reception, learning is revisited and cyclical to ensure the children have a deep understanding of the skills and content being taught. This means that previous themes and skills from Autumn Term will also be worked on, discussed and revisited throughout the Spring Term. Please see Autumn 1 and Autumn 2 Long Term Plans for more detail.

- Explore artwork made by great artists.
- Test their ideas.
- Explore and create using a wide range of materials and components, including upcycled materials, construction kits, textiles and ingredients.

<u>UW</u>

- Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.
- Develop scientific knowledge through play activities, sharing stories and non-fiction books and discussion.
- Sort and group materials and resources and talk about how they are similar or different.
- Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them
- Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries

<u>PD</u>

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- Know and talk about different factors that support wellbeing e.g. regular exercise, healthy eating.
- Develop overall body-strength, balance, co-ordination and agility

<u>PSED</u>

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- Set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate.
- Work and play cooperatively and take turns with others.
