Programmes of Study

Geography

- Name and locate the world's 7 continents and 5 oceans.
- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the 4 countries and capital cities of the UK and its surrounding seas.
- Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.
- Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language (e.g. near and far; left and right), to describe the location of features and routes on a map.
- Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and their key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.
