Samurai –Tested on 20 from across the 2 tables of 30 words.

You should highlight any of the words that you misspell so that you focus on when revising.

Many of the key spellings are repeated to help ensure that you can spell them accurately.

Earning Your Bands

Every five weeks there will be a band test which

will be on a selection of words from the 4 previous weeks.

This test will be on 30 words.

In order to achieve your band you will need to get 25 out of 30 to pass.

The first time you pass a band test you will be awarded Band 1. The second time you pass a band test you will be awarded Band 2, and so on. In order to gain the final black band for your level, you will have to have passed the 5 previous band tests.

If you are finding the Ninja level easy, your teacher may choose to move you on to Samurai level.

By adding the prefixes **in, im, il,** or **ir**, you often make the antonym (opposite of the word), eg 'irregular' means 'not regular' and 'imperfect' means 'not perfect'.

Some words do not use these letter combinations as a prefix, eg. 'imagine'

Cluster: Doubling the last consonant

A lot of words double the last consonant before adding *a suffix, eg. -ly,- ing, -ed, -ence*. They are words that have a single vowel followed by one consonant and the stress is at the end of the word.

If the last syllable isn't stressed you don't need to double the consonant.

Cluster: Plurals

All you need to do is add -es to make the plurals words ending in x, sh, s, ss, and ch.

Some words which end with the letter **f** change the **f** to a **v** before adding **es** to make the plural. Words which end with a consonant and then a **y** change the **y** to an **i** before adding **es** to make the plural.

Cluster: Drop or Keep 'e'

For words ending with a silent 'e' (achieve), drop the 'e' when adding a vowel suffix such as '-ing' (achieving).

Add '-ly' to a word whether or not the word ends with a vowel (extreme + ly) or a consonant (hopeless + ly). The few exceptions to this rule need to be learned.


Earn extra epraise points
