Spanish Lessons at Valley Gardens



The MFL department will be running two Spanish lessons. The Year 8 lesson on Wednesday will be delivered by Mrs Thomson and is an opportunity for those pupils who are thinking about doing Spanish at Whitley Bay High School to get a grounding in the fundamentals of the language. Focus will be on speaking and pronunciation, but there will be written work too. The Year 5 and 6 lesson on Thursday lunchtime will be delivered by Mr Oliver. This will be an opportunity for pupils to start from the very basics. The aim is to continue this program of study next academic year and build upon the foundations of what they have learnt this year.

European Day of Languages

The European Day of Languages (EDL) is celebrated across Europe on the 26th of September every year. It aims to promote the rich linguistic diversity of Europe and raise awareness of the importance of lifelong language learning for everyone. It was set up by the Council of Europe and was first celebrated in 2001.

Pupils in Valley Gardens Middle School marked this event with a number of activities and even a competition.
