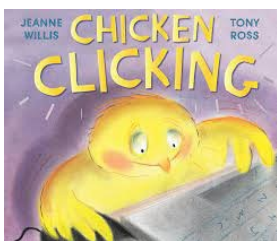

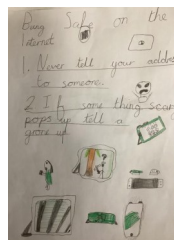
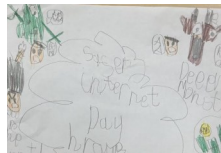


All Year groups have been reading the story Chicken Clicking which talks about the importance of not sharing details to others.
