Discuss the sea creatures you find throughout the story. Do you know of any more?	Read each word to your child and ask them to write it down and say the sounds as they write each one. Stretch the word out the help your child hear all the sounds. Encourage your child to read each word out loud after writing it to check. Words to read and write: crab, step, grub, smell	Practise subtracting amounts. Line up 10 items on a wall or in the garden. Practise counting them all and taking one away each time. How many do you have left? What is happening to the amount left on the wall? 10 Green bottles is a great song to sing whilst taking an item off the water. Why not fill plastic cups up with water and knock one off the wall each time. After practising subtracting one (one less) practising taking away more. Can your child write the number sentence and explain it. 10 - 3 = 7 10 cups on the wall and I take away 3, that leaves 7 cups left. That's less. That's a smaller amount.	Make an Easter card for a family member. You could draw an egg and cut a zig zag line through the middle of it. It will look like a cracked egg. You could draw a chick to sit inside your egg.
