Go on a minibeast hunt and write sentences about the creatures you find using the word "and" to make a longer sentence.</p>	<p><b>Home Tuck Shop - Create your own tuck shop/snack shop at home.</b> Each day everyone should be given the same amount of money to spend. Create a price list and let your child have a go at using coins to pay for their own snacks.</p> <p>For example: Daily limit - 50p</p> <p>Piece of fruit - 6p Vegetables - 6p Crisps - 25p</p>	<p><b>Espresso - News Bites - Quiz.</b></p> <p>Using Espresso watch the weekly news bites video and complete the follow up quiz. This can be found under KS1 - News - News Bites + Quiz. Listen to the video together.</p> <p>Discuss which story interested you the most? What new facts did you learn?</p>

<p>Read a story that you have at home, or listen to a story on Cbeebies bedtime stories or Espresso.</p> <p>Before you begin the story read the title of the story to your child. What do you think the story might be about? What might happen in this story?</p> <p>Throughout the story ask your child what they think might happen next?</p> <p>Discuss the story with your child what was your favourite part? Who was your favourite character? What would you change?</p>	<p>Read this sentence out loud to your child - <b>Arthur and his father put the dark green cars into a jar.</b></p> <p>Ask your child to write this sentence one word at a time. Remind them to use finger spaces, a capital letter and a full stop.</p>	<p><b>Shape Hunt</b> - Whilst on a walk or around your house see what different shapes you can find.</p> <p>How many objects can you find that are shaped like a square? What objects are shaped like a triangle? How many Circles can you find? How many sides does each shape have?</p> <p>You could draw or make a list of all the different shapes you find.</p>	<p>Using any junk modeling or recycling you have can you make a windchime to hang in your garden?</p> <p>You could use an empty bottle, old plastic cups or yoghurt pots. You could decorate them with ribbon, beads, bottle tops, straws.</p>
