

Now practice writing these words using the joins you have just practiced:

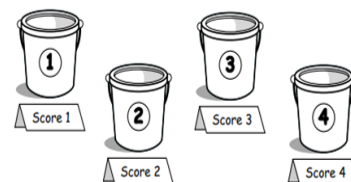

More than one bag can go in a bucket.




1. What is the highest score Dan can get?

<p>Read these words: never, banner, done, gnome, knock, and, dinner, gone, gnat, knife. Remember to say the sounds as you read the word! How do you spell /n/ in these words? Write them into categories on a piece of paper according to how you spell /n/. Say the sounds as you write the words</p>	<p>Parents: ask your child to read this sentence OR read this sentence to your child: Norris was eating his dinner when there was a knock at the door. He put down his knife and fork to see who it was. Ask your child to write this sentence and underline the different ways we spell /n/. If your child misspells one of the words in bold, help them to write it again correctly. REMEMBER TO SAY THE SOUNDS AS YOU WRITE THEM - IT HELPS THE LEARNING TO STICK!</p>	<p>Practice counting in 3's 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 21, 24, 27, 30, 33, 36</p> <p>Practice counting in 3's as you clap, skip, step on each step as you climb the stairs.</p> <p>Draw groups of 3 and write a number sentence to match e.g.</p>  <p>You can do this on paper or Purple mash 2do set.</p>	<p>During WW2 music was important to cheer people up.
