

<p>This week your reading is linked with National Empathy Day (9.6.20). Empathy is the ability to understand the feelings of others. Choose a book from home that you enjoy reading. Read it to your grown up, pet or even soft toy.</p> <p>Now think carefully about the main character in the story, this could be a good or bad character it doesn't matter. Think about what they do, and why they do it. Can you talk about their feelings in the story? Did their feelings affect their actions?</p>	<p>Now after doing your English reading and wider curriculum tasks for this week, draw your favourite character from the story you read. Then write one sentence about each of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• their feelings• why they did what they did in the story• did you agree with what they did? Why? 
All About Animals!

<p>Read these words with /w/ in: (w, wh) when, water, what, where, window, why, weather. Remember to say the sounds as you read the word!</p> <p>How do you spell /w/ in these words? Write them into categories on a piece of paper according to how you spell /w/. Say the sounds as you write the words.</p>	<p>Parents: ask your child to read these sentences OR read these sentences to your child: When he went in the water William was cold. Whatever the weather wear a warm coat! Ask your child to write these sentences and underline the different ways we spell /w/. If your child misspells one of the words in bold, help them to write it again correctly.
