Think about what information would be on a leavers t-shirt:

Read these words with /o/ in: (o and a) **stop, swat, Tom, wash, what** and **bottle**. Remember to say the sounds as you read the word!

How do you spell /o/ in these words? Write them into categories on a piece of paper according to how you spell /i/. Say the sounds as you write the words.

Parents: ask your child to read these sentences OR read these sentences to your child:

Tom what are you doing? I'm swatting a wasp! Ask your child to write these sentences and underline the different ways we spell /o/. If your child misspells one of the words in bold, help them to write it again correctly. REMEMBER TO SAY THE SOUNDS AS YOU WRITE THEM - IT HELPS THE LEARNING TO STICK!
