Discuss the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements.
Summer 1	Grace Darling and Lighthouses	Grace Darling, Lighthouse, Longstone, heroine, hero, Forfarshire, ship, farne islands, Northumberland, past, Victorian, compare, now, then.	 Talk about Grace Darling stating who she was and where she lived. Discuss the differences between some aspects of life today and in the past. Describe what happened on the night of the storm. Identify why Grace is a Heroine and how she is remembered.
