<p><u>Autumn 1</u></p> <p>Texts: Rosie's Walk by Pat Hutchins Narrative: Retell Rosie's Walk using a story map. Retell the story of Rosie's Walk.</p> <p>Non-Narrative: Name the animals in Rosie's Walk. Using and understanding positional language</p>	<p><u>Autumn 2</u></p> <p>Texts: Dear Zoo and Dear Santa by Rod Campbell Narrative: Retell the story of Dear Zoo/Dear Santa. Retell Rosie's Walk using a story map.</p> <p>Non-Narrative: Factual writing linked to Dear Zoo/Dear Santa Draw/Write a list. Label a parcel. Write name on a Christmas card.</p>
<p><u>Spring 1</u></p> <p>Text: We're Going on a Bear Hunt by Michael Rosen Narrative: Retell the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt. Sequence pictures from the story. Draw a picture from the story.</p> <p>Non-Narrative: Factual writing linked to We're Going on a Bear Hunt. Draw/ List the places where the bear goes. Label work with name. To say a sentence to describe the weather.</p>	<p><u>Spring 2</u></p> <p>Text: Each Peach Pear Plum by Janet and Allan Ahlberg Narrative: Retell Each Peach Pear Plum with actions. Draw a story map to sequence the story. Children draw pictures linked to who they can spy in the story. Recall rhymes linked to the characters; Jack and Jill, Tommy Thumb, Mother Hubbard, Baby bunting. Innovate the story using characters from traditional tales.</p> <p>Non-Narrative: Make a telescope and go on a hunt for interesting things we can 'spy'. Make a simple 'I spy' zig zag book</p>
<p><u>Summer 1</u></p> <p>Text: The Very Busy Spider by Eric Carle Narrative: Retell the story of The Very Busy Spider with actions. Draw a story map of The Very Busy Spider. Say which other animals could be busy on the farm. Sing Incy Wincy Spider</p> <p>Non-Narrative: Factual writing linked to The Very Busy Spider Draw and label a spider. Draw and label a farm animal.</p>	<p><u>Summer 2</u></p> <p>Text: The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle Narrative: Retell story using actions. Draw a story map of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. Draw and write in a zig zag book- the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar.</p> <p>Non-Narrative: Factual writing linked to The Very Hungry Caterpillar Create a list of minibeasts you might find in your garden. Draw and label a picture of a minibeast. Talk about what they found in the garden and where they found it.</p>
