There are many opportunities for students to **SHINE** at Winstanley and rewarded for meeting our school values.

Every lesson, we aim for students to achieve at least two SHINE points. These points accumulate and are recognised and rewarded at certain milestones. In addition to SHINE points, teachers routinely text, phone and send postcards home for

good work or extra effort. We also have a 'shout out' board in the staffroom to enable all staff to congratulate students who have done something special.

Every classroom door has a 'Top learner, achiever and Shine' recognition board which teachers and tutors update weekly to celebrate the students who are excelling or putting in extra effort.
