

On the move

The Shine Centre, have taken delivery of a 'Variety 17 seater Sunshine Bus', which has been part funded by a generous grant from the Orbit Housing Group, through their scheme to support communities and young people. Sunshine Coaches are donated by Variety to schools and children's organisations for educational, recreational and vocational purposes. The SHINE Centre offers a curriculum for students who have Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) difficulties. An important part of this involves education outside of the classroom and engagement with their local community. Students will be able to take part in

alternative curriculum provision which isn't available on the school site, such as construction, motor vehicle work and the arts.

Fraser Danvers who runs the centre said: 'This generous donation from the Variety Club and Orbit will undoubtedly make a huge difference to the lives of the young people we work with in the SHINE Centre. It will allow us to have more flexibility with our personalised curriculum and therapeutic provisions.'
