School Uniform Policy

Principles

Policy regarding students' dress and appearance is based on the following core values:

- it should present a positive image that supports the ethos of the school and gives a sense of corporate identity
- \cdot it should provide value for money to parents and carers and protect against the dictates of fashion
- \cdot it should promote harmony and safety between all students whilst at school and when travelling to/from home
- \cdot it should support effective teaching and learning
- \cdot it should be inclusive: socially, culturally and religiously, providing this does not conflict with the values above

Policy:

All students who attend Winstanley are required to wear uniform. If a student turns up to school wearing incorrect uniform, we will either:

- 1. Loan them the necessary items (in the event they have left something at home)
- 2. Sell them the items (in the event that they have lost or damaged something)

The school tie will be gifted to all students upon entry to the school.

The Winstanley school blazer as well as blue tops for PE, should be bought from our suppliers, who are

School ties should be purchased from The Winstanley School and cost ± 7 . Money for this will be taken from SQUID.

Other uniform items should be bought from the school-wear ranges of chain stores, department stores, catalogues or specialist shops. Fashion items and logos are not acceptable and no student is permitted to wear branded clothing in school

The following items are required FOR ALL STUDENTS:

- 1. Winstanley School blazer and tie
- 2. Plain white formal shirt
- 3. Plain black formal trousers or suitable school skirt
- 4. All black school shoes or trainers with flat heel no colour is permitted on school footwear

NB: should students choose to wear the school skirt it must be an appropriate pleated school skirt from a school supplier. Tube, A-line and pencil skirts are not permitted. Skirts should be worn modestly and no shorter than just above the knee.

Students wearing skirts must wear black tights*. Any belts should be plain and black with a small buckle.

Students are welcome to wear TWS or plain, navy blue v-neck school jumper, underneath their blazers. Students must still wear a blazer. Students who wear other garments between their blazer and their shirt will be asked to remove it.

Coats, preferably black, may be worn on top of blazers. They may not be substitutes for blazers.

In hot weather during the summer term, plain black tailored shorts of sensible knee length and designed for school will be acceptable. Students in skirts can wear white or black socks instead of tights.

Sensible judgements should be made about the need to wear blazers in class during hot weather however blazers must be worn to school each day.

PE Kit

P.E. kit is available to purchase from our school supplier.

All students require:

- 1. Blue polo top with Winstanley logo
- 2. Black shorts/tracksuit.
- 3. In cold weather, a blue fleece top with the Winstanley logo may be worn.
- 4. Students must change out of their kit and back into school dress before leaving the changing rooms.

Students will also need to bring a towel and swimming trunks/costume when they are swimming. A verruca sock should be worn in the event of skin conditions which are contagious. Goggles can be worn if accompanied with a parental letter at the beginning of the swimming block. A plastic bag is advisable for wet clothing.

Students who bring a note to be excused from a PE lesson must still bring their kit so that they can take part in the lesson in some capacity. They would not be expected to take part in all of the usual activities but may be asked to referee or keep the score.

Hair colouring/hairstyles:

We discourage parents from allowing their children to dye their hair. Any colouring outside the range of natural shades and hairstyles that are, in the school's opinion extreme, are **not allowed**. This includes hair extensions of unnatural colours.

Jewellery:

Students are allowed to wear one pair of small, discreet earrings, such as sleepers or studs and one finger ring. Students may wear one small nose stud. All other facial piercings are not permitted on site.

We do not allow any ornate jewellery, particularly large sovereign type rings, or badges with slogans in school. N.B. We class body piercings as jewellery.

For safety reasons students must remove all jewellery for P.E. lessons and may be asked to do this for practical lessons such as Design or Science.

On the whole we advise against students wearing jewellery to school, and we cannot take responsibility for loss or damage.

Make up:

Excessive make up is not allowed and students will be asked to remove this. If make up is worn it should be barely noticeable. False eyelashes and false nails (including acrylics and gels e.g. BIAB) are not to be worn in school. Students who wear these will be asked to remove them before attending lessons.

Head wear:

Students are not permitted to wear headwear inside school unless for religious/cultural reasons. In these instances, the headwear must be plain black. In cold or hot weather, we would welcome students wearing appropriate headwear to protect them from the elements, these should be suitable for school and only worn outside.
