## **SHINE** Values

Supporting others, Hard work, Independence and Never giving up, drive everything we do at Winstanley: together they lead to Excellence. The SHINE values underpin all aspects of the social, cultural and academic curriculum. We aim for every student to 'SHINE brighter than you thought you could'.

We have high aspirations for our students and therefore have high expectations. A key part of our focus on first attention to best conduct is celebrating success and rewarding effort and attainment regularly. We want all students to develop their confidence and grasp each and every opportunity that they are offered during their time at school.

Because we are a small school we can offer a nurturing and supportive environment where everyone is known. We are very proud to be one of only two schools in Leicestershire to have been awarded the Inclusion Quality Mark which recognises our supportive and inclusive ethos: our non-teaching heads of House are available throughout the day to support all students to SHINE.





We know how important careful preparation is to ensure the transition to secondary school is as smooth as possible. Winstanley staff visit our feeder primary schools and we aim to provide several occasions when primary students (Year 5 & 6) are involved in activities either at Winstanley or with our students. Where students may need a more bespoke transition programme we provide many opportunities to visit and become familiar with the school.

#### **Pastoral Care**

We know that students learn best when they feel happy and safe. As a small school we are able to know each student well and offer a wide range of support. The CREW leader is the first point of contact for students and their parents and carers. Students will be in CREW for 50 minutes each day where we have a programme of activities based on target setting, developing student agency and our SHINE values. CREW leaders will also deliver SHINE lessons once every two week cycle which will include the statutory PSHE and careers programmes.

CREW leaders are supported by non-teaching Heads of House and the wider learning support team to ensure that issues are resolved before they can become barriers to learning. Our house system enables all students to have a sense of belonging and be part of a team which is made up from all year groups. Prefects and ambassadors from each house are available to help students to feel settled and valued within the school community.

All year 7 & 8 students will follow a bespoke curriculum designed across the LiFE MAT: the Real LiFE curriculum. This curriculum aims to ensure that students gain knowledge, skills and values through an enquiry focused approach which provides personalisation, immersion and product oriented learning. The Real LiFE curriculum is delivered through CREW (coaching, reflection, enrichment and wonderful work) sessions which give the students meaningful opportunities to develop as learners. Alongside CREW students will experience crosscurricular missions as well as discrete 'traditional' subject lessons. Cross-curricular missions focus on real world issues or problems with specific themes linked to the UN Global Goals for Sustainable Development. There will be regular opportunities for the students to showcase their progress whilst developing their confidence and presentation skills.



During year 8 students will be able to make a choice form a wide range of option subjects to create their GCSE pathway. All students (with their parent/carers) will have an interview with a senior member of staff to support their decision making.

#### Years 9-11

In years 9-11 all students study Maths, English, Science and History or Geography or a foreign language. Further subjects studied will depend on the individual options pathway. Options available to choose from include Fine Art, Drama, Computer Science, Business Studies, Hospitality and Catering, Media Studies, Music, Resistant Materials, PE and Sports Studies.

Across all year groups students will have learning activities designed to motivate, stretch and challenge them. Wider curricular opportunities are also organised to raise aspiration, inspire and support all our learners.

Students' individual needs are met by the learning support and pastoral teams, supporting each individual students learning, emotional and social needs. When a particular learning need cannot be addressed within the usual classroom provision small group withdrawal may occur. Additional literacy and numeracy lessons are offered in this way.



#### Wider curriculum opportunities

Within lessons students will experience authentic learning experiences which link their learning to real events, issues or scenarios. Subject areas also provide opportunities for wider experiential learning to broaden and deepen enjoyment of their subject through clubs, such as sports clubs, STEM activities, music and Arts clubs as well as through organising visits to places and events of interest or importance. The after school Aspire programme provides a wide range of activities. All students attending Aspire Clubs will also be able to access a free meal at the end of the session.

#### Rewards

Each term students that work consistently hard in lessons are nominated to receive subject colours. Teachers send postcards home to notify parents of in lesson successes and every lesson that a student meets expectations they will receive positive behaviour points which contribute to being able to access rewards. Excellent attendance brings reward opportunities as well. Students that have demonstrated improvement or have been an active part of the community will be invited to 'hot chocolate with the Head'. House challenges and the Supernova scheme offer further opportunities to reward students that demonstrate the SHINE values.

During Year 10 students can apply to become the prefects. A rigorous selection process is undertaken to ensure that our prefect body are role models who demonstrate the SHINE values. Prefects are expected to represent the school with visitors and at events; participate in assemblies, mentor the younger students and inspire others to follow in their footsteps.


