Comprehension questions you can ask your child to help them with their reading.

These questions are a guide to help you with your child's reading. The emphasis on reading in key stage 2 is understanding and interpreting the text. You do not have to ask all of these questions at the same time. Choose two or three to ask your child after they have read to you. Your child should be reading to you for ten minutes each day.
