

Small School News



Early Years

Foundation 1 have been learning about fireworks. We have been reading about Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate bonfire night. The children have also been learning about firework safety. We have all had great fun experimenting with different materials to make rockets and using lots of different colours to make firework pictures!

Foundation 2 Fen Street children have come back and settled straight back into the routines of school. Well done. We have begun our project on big sparks this week looking at fireworks. We have made painted fireworks in lots of different ways with our hands, marbles and brushes. We have also made rockets and even made our own firework show. Next week we will begin our project on space. We will be sending home a box of key words and letter sounds for you to practise with your child. Please ensure this box is kept in your child's book bag everyday. We will look together at these key words when your child does their reading. Please practise these at least once a day. Some of these words you cannot sound out, the children will need to learn these by sight. We will also begin changing for PE next week (Fen Street) so please bring in your PE kits for Tuesday. Please can you also remember to send your child's reading books and records with them every day.

Countess Way children have had a fantastic first week! The children are energized and ready to learn after their week off. We have done some amazing learning on owl babies and firework night. The children have enjoyed making fireworks and putting on their own displays. We will continue our brilliant learning next week.

Infant School

Year 1 Countess Way children have had a fantastic start to their Great Fire of London Project. We enjoyed doing some big art of flames and houses to create an amazing display in our project area. It was lovely to see all the children dressed up for our ignite day, where we did lots of activities from the Stuart Era including candle making and sewing!

Fen Street children also stepped back in time to 1666 to discover how The Great Fire of London began. We have loved creating our scenes of the burning buildings and experiencing daily activities from the era as well as looking at Samuel Pepys diary in literacy.

We will be collecting empty cereal boxes to make Tudor houses. Also, if anyone would like to donate their Fire of London costume, we are going to set up a costume box for Year 1.

Please could you have a look at home for our small wooden hearts? Some of them may have gone home as they are kept safe in pockets throughout the day.

Year 2 have had a really exciting start to the half term due to them turning their classrooms into the journey of chocolate! We have created a jungle area to show where cocoa beans come from as well as a shop to show where we get chocolate from! We have really enjoyed this and hope that you will come and see it!

Lower Junior

Year 3 have excitedly begun their new project, natural disasters. Our art day was a great success and we have gained lots of new knowledge about earthquakes, volcanoes and tornadoes.

Year 3/4 have been igniting their new project 'Dragons!' We've been creating our own huge willow dragon with the help of Mrs. Broome, and we've used the film How to Train Your Dragon to help us in describing dragons and writing diary entries. In maths we've been honing our skills in division, in particular chunking!

Year 4 have had an exciting start to the half term igniting their Pirate project this week! All of the children dived straight in to character on Monday morning, thank you to all the parents for supporting us and your children to get into character - there were some fabulous costumes! We all had a great day finding out lots of facts about the lives of pirates, completing a treasure hunt and making musical instruments! We have also been busy this week creating our pirate themed classroom environments and the children have been getting creative with their art skills. In Maths we are continuing with multiplication and division, so keep up the times tables practise!

Upper Junior

Year 5 have had their frozen planet topic ignited by an amazing art day where they created animals, igloos, snowflakes, ice cubes etc. We also had a really insightful visitor explain all about the Arctic and Antarctica and watched some clips from the Frozen Planet series by David Attenborough, which really captivated everyone. We have also started our new descriptive story text, 'The Snow Leopard' and have continued to improve our multiplication knowledge.

Year 6 have had a busy week- we went to Oakgrove for a Maths morning, which was excellent! We watched The Hobbit movie on Wednesday and have decorated our classrooms themed to our Hobbit project using inspiration from the film!
