We would like to say a big thank you to parents for completing the homework so promptly this week! Gathering pupil voice is a fundamental aspect of personalised teaching and learning and we appreciate you supporting us with this. We have been extremely impressed by the maturity of the children when reflecting on this homework. They commented on how useful it was to see their year group standard in order to set themselves next steps and long term goals. Year 6 pupils have also passed on very positive feedback from parents too which is great to hear! Hopefully you now have a better understanding of the standard for your child's year group and feel more aware of knowledge and skills they will need for a successful year. We encourage you to speak to your child's teacher if you ever have any questions about completing homework. As always, thank you for working in partnership with us at Brooklands Farm.

We have a growing number of children who are coming to school without having any breakfast. As you know, breakfast is the most important meal of the day, and this is especially true for children! Their growing bodies and developing brains need regular refuelling, particularly after a long sleep. Studies have found that eating breakfast may enhance memory, improve cognitive ability, and help increase attention span. Providing your child with a healthy breakfast ensures your child has the best possible start to the day. Remember to include a drink too - being well hydrated also helps improve concentration.

We are very aware that the road layouts around our community have changed recently and our behaviours around the roads must be more cautious. Please can you discuss road safety with your children over the weekend to feedback to their class next week.

Also, can all the children discuss their role as a leader in our school? We have sent home letters highlighting the criteria for each of our leader posts available in school.

### Latest News

**Nut Free School:** A reminder that Brooklands Farm is a nut free school, therefore please ensure that any food which is bought in by children is nut free. This includes morning snacks and packed lunches.

**Macmillan Coffee Morning:** We will be hosting a Macmillan Coffee Morning on <u>Friday 25th September</u>. There will be three sessions at <u>8am, 1pm and 3pm at Countess Way</u>, bring along something sweet, we'll provide the tea and coffee. We look forward to seeing you there to raise money for a great cause.

**Bicycles, Scooters and Skateboards:** Please remember that bicycles, scooters, skateboards, etc should not be ridden across the playground or courtyard. They should be parked in the bicycle racks near the school gates. Please remind children to walk their bikes and scooters to the gates before riding them.

Countess Way Car Parks: You may use both car parks at Countess Way for drop-off and pick up.

Water Bottles and Book Bags: Please can all children in years 1-6 both at Fen Street and Countess way bring in a named water bottle so that they have access to a drink throughout the day. Also, may we ask that children bring a book bag to school rather than other types of bags as book bags fit nicely into their trays and we do not have the space for bulky rucksacks, etc.

**Fen Street Breakfast/Activity/Care Club Entrance:** In the interest of safety and safeguarding, we have made the decision to change the entrance for Breakfast Club drop-off and Care Club/KS2 Activities collection. We will no longer be using the door at the end of the hall corridor. <u>We will now be using the main entrance in Reception</u>. A member of staff will be available to let you in.

Collection for KS1 Activities will remain the same in the cross corridor.

**Chartwells:** The cut-off for ordering school dinners is now <u>midnight Sunday the week before</u>.

We are aware that some parents are having difficulties ordering online and have been unable to get through to the Customer Care Line. Chartwells have provided us with a troubleshooting guide which was sent via ParentMail and are available in Reception. If you are still having trouble, please contact Jill at Fen Street next week to arrange a time to come in and do the order for week commencing 5th October together.

# **Pin Assemblies**


Pin assemblies will be held in your child's classroom. Parents/Carers are invited to attend but please sign in at Reception and then accompany your child to their classroom.

Early Years
