

Small School News



Early Years

Foundation 1 have been learning the story Owl Babies by Martin Waddell.

Children at Countess Way have enjoyed gathering twigs and leaves to make nests and acted out the story using lolly stick puppets. We will be continuing our learning about owls next week. We will make some owl models out of recycled materials or clay.

Fen Street children loved coming into nursery dressed in their pyjamas and learning all about nocturnal animals. They have been busy making owls using leaves and straw and finding out how their feathers keep them warm and help them to fly.

Please can we remind you that the children still need to bring in a set of spare clothes to nursery. They can leave them here on their pegs.

Infant School

Year 1 have been very determined and have started to peer review their learning. They have been busy at the review station checking their learning against their success criteria and working together in their learning trios to grow their learning. Next week the children will be designing and creating their own shelters to create and communicate their project learning. Please can you bring in any junk modelling and recycling materials you have at home to help the children with the building stage.

Year 2 have been working really hard on their writing this week! We have written a recount of the Lantern Festival which we all really enjoyed. We are also writing a character description of the character we made for homework last week. In maths we have been looking at fractions using pasta, pizza, string and cubes to help us. They have also enjoyed their learning in Project lessons. They have been extremely engaged in finding out how to be a healthy eater and the life cycle of a frog! Keep up the great learning Year 2!

Just a couple of reminders to please write in your child's Reading Record book after reading at home so that we can see how they are progressing and please may we ask that the children only bring in fruit for their morning snack. Thank you.

Lower Junior

Year 3 have been working really hard on writing their final draft of their information text. It is brilliant to see how much knowledge we have all gained throughout our Natural Disasters project. In maths, we have been learning more about division and connecting our knowledge to word problems. I hope you all enjoyed the Lantern Festival as much as we did, it was fantastic to see you all there.

Year 3/4 (Countess Way) have been consolidating lots of their learning this term in maths to create their own problems using the 4 operations. These have been challenging and have shown a deep understanding of +, -, x and ÷ with particular focus on fractions too. In project, children are using their literacy skills to communicate a new character to eventually be sent to Dreamworks Studio! Keep up those learning zones!

Year 4 have finished connecting our multiplication and division skills and moved onto learning about fractions! We have also been doing some wonderful writing this week, delving into the lives of pirates and inventing our own pirate diary entries. The children have been working really hard to grow their learning and achieve! In music this week the children have continued to develop their singing skills as well as creating their own rhythms on drums. Keep up the hard work!

Upper Junior

Year 5 have worked really well in their literacy this week, learning about play scripts and acting out a script. They have also grown their knowledge of cubed, squared and prime numbers and used their division and multiplication understanding to solve different problems in maths.
