The Process and KS4 Programme




What is the Futures Programme?

- Start students thinking about the choices that they have ahead of them
- Learn about the different options post Key Stage Three
- Explore careers and how to get on the right pathway
- Start to examine their interests, aptitudes and personal qualities
- Create excitement about the future and build aspiration



What are Cambridge Nationals

- They are challenging and well respected qualifications equivalent to GCSEs.
- Instead of being 100% exam, they feature coursework and internally assessed units which may suit some students better.
- They provide you with knowledge and highly sought-after skills.
- They provide access to A Levels and degree programmes in most colleges and universities.
- Faculty Leaders can help decide which is the best course for students to pursue.





Subjects with more than one course

- You cannot select two courses of the same or very similar subject as your main choices.
- You can select one as a main choice and one as a reserve though.
- E.g. You can select GCSE Engineering as a main choice and GCSE Design & Technology as a reserve choice. They cannot both be chosen as main choices.
- The same applies to GCSE Economics and Business Studies.
- The same applies to GCSE Art and Photography.
- To maximise choices available Post 16 we recommend choosing a range of subjects from different disciplines.



Languages

- You can only select one language (German, Mandarin or Spanish) and that should be the one you are studying at the Academy now.
- You cannot select one of these languages if you are not studying it at the Academy now. If you want to discuss this, then please speak to the Faculty Leader for Languages, Mr Hillage.
- GCSE exams in community languages can be sat at the Academy. The Faculty Leader for Languages will advertise this to parents and students next Academic year.



Will students get their first choices?

- 91% of students received all their main choices last year
- There will be some combinations that cannot work on the timetable
- A subject may have too many students so we use order of preference and student information from the course leaders to allocate places
- A student has to meet entry requirements for certain subjects
- Students should list choices in order of preference
- We will always seek to give students their first choice (Option 1) and their second and third choice (Option 2).

No. The Faculty Leader for Science decides which students are able to achieve well doing the Separate Science qualifications


- Separate Science is high challenge

How can you help your child decide?

- What subjects do they <u>want</u> to study and what do they <u>enjoy</u>?
- What do they have an aptitude for? <u>Grades</u> determine next stage.
- Make sure they are not choosing the same options as their friends.
- All subjects are valued and a balanced set of qualifications is best
- Discuss their ideas about their career/future and watch the subject videos so you know what each course involves.
- Make sure they are talking to staff
