Year 11

Year 11 students continue to prepare for their GCSEs, with the first written examinations in May; some practical examinations will occur sooner. Year 11 students are working hard and are being supported by staff at this crucial time, with a set of core mock exams completed in early March.

The Easter break will be a welcome chance to rest, but do please help your children to schedule some essential revision in the holiday.
