What is bullying?



At Graham James Primary Academy, a bully is someone who <u>hurts</u> someone more than once, by using behaviour which is meant to hurt, frighten or upset another person.

BULLYING IS NOT...

- When friends fall out.
- When children argue or have a disagreement.
- Accidents.

What to do if you are bullied:

DO:



- Ask them to STOP (if you can)
- Ignore them
- Use eye contact and say 'GO AWAY'
- Walk away
- Remember it's not your fault!
- TELL SOMEONE!!!!!

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DON'T:



- Do what they say
- Get angry or upset
- Hit them or fight them
- Think it's your fault
- Keep it to yourself
- Take it personally



What our school does to respond to bullying:

- We listen to the child and offer support
- We work together with families to find solutions
- THERE ARE CONSEQUENCES FOR BULLYING BEHAVIOUR!

What should I do if I see someone being bullied?



- If it is safe, go up to the bully and tell them to STOP!
- Tell an adult
- Don't act like nothing is happening Take action!
- Be a good friend.
