Premium left over - £3,113.35 – This amount will be used in the 2018/19 academic year as time constraints did not allow this to be spent in the 2017/18 academic year. The reason for this is due to saving for new playground markings for the school playground. During the 2017/18 academic year – the				

children of GJPA (student voice) expressed a desire to have new playground markings in order for more sporting activities/ activities they could independently participate in at break/ lunch times. As a result – each class will choose a playground marking that will be added to the playground area with the aim at maximising PE/ sport participation. Also a ‘Daily Mile’ track will be marked out as the school aim to introduce this health/ fitness development initiative in the 2018/19 academic year.
