<b>Summary of Primary Sport Premium 2019/2020</b>	
Objectives of spend; (in line with our academies PE curriculum 'intent':	
<p><b>INTENT:</b> PE at Graham James develops a child's knowledge, skill and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. Our curriculum is enhanced by carefully selected extra-curricular clubs whereby children can further develop skills via specialist coaches/teachers. In order to promote lifelong participation, all of our curricular and extra-curricular clubs can be continued within the local community (e.g. football clubs – East Thurrock United, netball clubs, athletics clubs Basildon/Thurrock Harriers, Gymnastics – Basildon Sporting Village, Swimming – Corringham Impulse Leisure etc). Therefore, our objectives are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils</li> <li>- To continue to provide the pupils of Graham James Primary Academy with high quality PE &amp; Sport provision</li> <li>- To have up to date equipment and resources in order for successful participation and enjoyment</li> <li>- To develop a love of PE &amp; sport in order to encourage lifelong participation</li> </ul>	
<b>2019/2020 – COVID-19 Impact</b>	
Our PE curriculum/ Extra Curricular programme was brought to a halt in March 2020 due to the closure of schools by the Government due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore – our engagement within the Thurrock SSP was reduced compared to previous years. This resulted in limited sporting opportunities and the provision of high quality PE and sport from March 2020 – August 2020.

In summary, for the 2019/2020 academic year, there has been an underspend of £4,220.43. This is a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic and school closures that took place in March 2020. Prior to the school closures, we were on track to be consistent with our historic overspend and dedication to high quality PE provision and opportunities at Graham James Primary Academy.

## 2020/ 2021 Spending Proposal

At Graham James Primary Academy, our aims for the 2020/2021 academic are:

- 1) To re-engage children into sport and exercise (return to school from pandemic lockdown 2020)
- 2) To continue to broaden the PE opportunities available to the children in order to help promote new sporting activities/ experiences
- 3) To give the children increased opportunity to take part in competitive sport
- 4) To continue to invest in teacher/LSA CPD in order to upskill staff in sport (improving delivery and learning outcomes for children)
- 5) To continue to support children with additional needs in order for them to access high quality PE

The PE offer at Graham James Primary Academy will follow Government guidance as outlined in 'Guidance for full opening: Schools'. With planning, Physical activity will be provided at a high quality level and will follow the control measures that are in place (e.g. consistent groupings/ sports equipment cleaned regularly/ hand washing before and after use etc).

Outdoor sports will be prioritised where possible, and our large indoor space (main hall) used where it is not, maximising natural ventilation flows (e.g. opening windows/doors wherever possible).

GJPA will have a big focus on the 'Daily Mile' during the 2020/2021 academic year in order to further engage children in daily exercise (this is particularly important in order to support re-engaging children back into sport and exercise as a result of the 2020 COVID-19 lockdown).
