#### Summary of Primary Sport Premium 2021/2022

Objectives of spend; (in line with our academies PE curriculum 'intent':

INTENT: PE at Graham James develops a child's knowledge, skill and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. Our curriculum is enhanced by carefully selected extra-curricular clubs whereby children can further develop skills via specialist coaches/teachers. In order to promote lifelong participation, all of our curricular and extra-curricular clubs can be continued within the local community (e.g. football clubs – East Thurrock United, netball clubs, athletics clubs Basildon/Thurrock Harriers, Gymnastics – Basildon Sporting Village, Swimming – Corringham Impulse Leisure etc). Therefore, our objectives are:

- To broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- To continue to provide the pupils of Graham James Primary Academy with high quality PE & Sport provision
- To have up to date equipment and resources in order for successful participation and enjoyment
- To develop a love of PE & sport in order to encourage lifelong participation

### 2021/2022 – COVID-19 Pandemic:

As of September 2021 – all school restrictions have been lifted with regards to school operation guidance in light of the Covid -19 pandemic – therefore, we are excited at GJPA to create an environment that encourages and engages all children to take part in daily activity and new sporting opportunities. Our school PE and Sport premium plan has been influenced by the voice of our learners (focus group – end of 2020/2021 academic year).
