Objectives of spend; (in line with our academies PE curriculum 'intent':

INTENT: PE at Graham James develops a child's knowledge, skill and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. Our curriculum is enhanced by carefully selected extra-curricular clubs whereby children can further develop skills via specialist coaches/teachers. In order to promote lifelong participation, all of our curricular and extra-curricular clubs can be continued within the local community (e.g. football clubs – East Thurrock United, netball clubs, athletics clubs Basildon/Thurrock Harriers, Gymnastics – Basildon Sporting Village, Swimming – Corringham Impulse Leisure etc). Therefore, our objectives are:

- To broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- To continue to provide the pupils of Graham James Primary Academy with high quality PE & Sport provision
- To have up to date equipment and resources in order for successful participation and enjoyment To develop a love of PE & sport in order to encourage lifelong participation

In summary, for the 2022/2023 academic year, GJPA have underspent by £316. We are incredibly proud of how we have spent the PE and Sport Premium this academic year. PE & sport engagement at GJPA has remained high and this was highlighted in our end of 2022/2023 PE & Sport survey. 91% of children from KS1 through to KS2 'enjoy' their PE lessons with a further 87% taking part in regular sport/exercise during break and lunch times. The introduction of new sports equipment/facilities has been successful with 89% stating that they had engaged with it throughout the school year. A further 72% of students in KS1 & KS2 have attended a lunch time sport club and 51% have attended an extra-curricular afterschool club. We will continue to build on this very positive feedback and will continue to make our best even better during the 2023/2024 academic year.

## 2023/2024 Spending Proposal – Estimated Funding £19,600

- 1) To continue to engage and excite children for school sport and exercise

- 4) To continue to support children with additional needs in order for them to access high quality PE
