Objectives of spend; (in line with our academies PE curriculum 'intent':

**INTENT:** PE at Graham James develops a child's knowledge, skill and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. Our curriculum is enhanced by carefully selected extra-curricular clubs whereby children can further develop skills via specialist coaches/teachers. In order to promote lifelong participation, all of our curricular and extra-curricular clubs can be continued within the local community (e.g. football clubs – East Thurrock United, netball clubs, athletics clubs Basildon/Thurrock Harriers, Gymnastics – Basildon Sporting Village, Swimming – Corringham Impulse Leisure etc). Therefore, our objectives are:

- To broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- To continue to provide the pupils of Graham James Primary Academy with high quality PE & Sport provision
- To have up to date equipment and resources in order for successful participation and enjoyment
- To develop a love of PE & sport in order to encourage lifelong participation
