Deforestation

The rainforests of Earth have quietly ticked away for millions of years, helping the planet to maintain a stable environment and providing homes for thousands of species of plants and animals. However, since the Industrial Revolution, humans have been removing them at an alarming rate. This is called deforestation.

Most of the damage has been done in the last 50 years or so. Roughly 17% of the Amazonian rainforest has been destroyed in the last half a century, and the figures continue to get worse. Over a billion acres of forest across the world has been destroyed since 1990.

In 2020, the amount of Amazon rainforest removed rose by an area the size of Israel. Bear in mind, this isn't how much was destroyed, but how much extra was destroyed compared to the year before.

The Paris Climate Agreement set targets for countries around the world to do their bit to help reduce carbon emissions. It has been estimated that stopping rainforest deforestation could achieve almost 25% of those aims. Unfortunately, many countries are still doing very little to stop it.


