Objectives of spend; (in line with our academies PE curriculum 'intent':

INTENT: PE at Graham James develops a child's knowledge, skill and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. Our curriculum is enhanced by carefully selected extra-curricular clubs whereby children can further develop skills via specialist coaches/teachers. In order to promote lifelong participation, all of our curricular and extra-curricular clubs can be continued within the local community (e.g. football clubs – East Thurrock United, netball clubs, athletics clubs Basildon/Thurrock Harriers, Gymnastics – Basildon Sporting Village, Swimming – Corringham Impulse Leisure etc). Therefore, our objectives are:

- To broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- To continue to provide the pupils of Graham James Primary Academy with high quality PE & Sport provision
- To have up to date equipment and resources in order for successful participation and enjoyment
- To develop a love of PE & sport in order to encourage lifelong participation

<p>In summary, for the 2025/2026 academic year, GJPA have overspent by £965.90. We are incredibly proud of how we have spent the PE and Sport Premium this academic year. PE & sport engagement at GJPA has remained high and this was highlighted in our end of 2025/2026 PE & Sport survey. 95% to 100% of children from KS1 through to KS2 'enjoy' their PE lessons (depending on activity) with a further 96% taking part in regular sport/exercise during break and lunch times. The introduction of new sports equipment/facilities has been successful with 98% stating that they had engaged with it throughout the school year. We will continue to build on this very positive feedback and will continue to make our best even better during the 2026/2027 academic year.</p> <p>Swimming data - End of year 3 outcomes 25/26</p> <p>This academic year, 59 pupils participated in swimming lessons. Of these, 59 children (100%) made measurable progress in their swimming ability (one child did not participate in the year group). Many pupils progressed from being non-swimmers to swimming independently, while others significantly increased the distance they could swim. By the end of the programme, 35 pupils were able to swim 25 metres or more, with several exceeding this distance across multiple strokes. The programme also saw excellent progress through the Swim England Duckling and Stage awards, demonstrating improvements in water confidence, stroke technique and water safety. Overall, the data reflects an exceptionally successful year of swimming provision.</p>
