Introduction

Each student chose their own topic that they felt passionate about and put their views into a speech. This speech was then presented in one of XP's Celebration of Learning evening's which allowed students to perform extracts from their speech in front of their family and those of other students.

Once, I had a cat called Jaffa. He just turned up at our house one day, and since he was so nice and friendly, we let him live with us. Jaffa stayed for about six weeks, but then we found out he was microchipped and took him back home to his real owners. However, he kept coming back, and after he was involved in a car crash we decided he'd only be safe somewhere a long way away from both of us. So we gave Jaffa to an animal rescue centre. The rescue centre we gave him to is a lovely one, but unfortunately not all of them are like that. Believe it or not, many rescue centres actually sell the cats that they are entrusted with to animal testers! Once, a shelter took in a pregnant cat but the very next day they sold her to a university. She had eight kittens, but each one of them died after a chemical was injected into their brains. On another occasion, a tabby called Double Trouble had a steel post screwed to her skull to stop her moving her head. The University even cut into her skull and put a toxic substance into her ears to make her deaf. However, cats aren't the only animals abused this way. Mice, rats and apes are also commonly experimented on.

When I say animal testing, you probably think of white mice running through mazes for a piece of cheese. Well, let me introduce you to the horrifying reality. Right now, millions of animals are locked up in laboratories across the country. They are in pain, they are lonely, they are sad but all they can do is sit and wait for the next painful procedure that will be performed on them. Can this be right? Take rabbits, for instance. Experimenters exploit their mild tempered nature on a daily basis, from dripping washing up liquid into their eyes to mutilating their spines. Dogs are another one. They are commonly used in toxicology experiments, where they are force-fed poisonous substances. Once, some experimenters surgically altered dogs, and then forced them to run on a treadmill until they collapsed of a heart attack. However, It gets worse. In a violent experiment at an American University, puppies had their eyes cut out, and were killed afterwards. Even our ancestors, apes, are tortured this way. They are targeted because they share many characteristics with humans, although experimenters treat them as though they are disposable pieces of laboratory equipment. But for apes, much of the abuse is psychological. Babies born in labs are torn from their screaming mothers, and are separated from them permanently. However, apes captured in the wild don't have it any easier. Numerous investigations have found that in order to abduct primates from their homes in the wild, people shoot their mothers down from the trees, stun the animals with dart guns, and then capture the babies. The animals are then packed into tiny crates and taken to filthy holding centres, with only a long and terrifying journey ahead of them. Does any animal really deserve this? Do they deserve to be tortured into an early grave? This isn't fair. So why does it happen? Why do governments not do anything to stop it? Why do some people approve of animal testing? The answer is that however much I feel that animal testing is evil, it is useful. Without it, for instance, we wouldn't have a cure for HIV. Processed food wouldn't be safe for us to eat, since all ready meals are tested on animals before they reach the shops.

However, although sometimes animal testing can be justified, other times it isn't even effective. For instance, there is only a 37% chance of cancer testing in rats applying to humans. Plus, there are many alternatives that don't involve hurting animals, such as sophisticated tests involving human cells and tissue. Yet still animals have to suffer, and are tormented on a daily basis by heartless scientists, some of whom have children of their own, yet don't give a thought to the animal families they are destroying. We have human rights, so why not animal rights? We are not alone in this world. We need to learn to care for the animals we share this planet with. But if we can't care for them, we at least need to stop abusing them. If we can't accept them as a part of our lives, we need

to let them get on with theirs. If we can't stop testing on animals, we need to stop and think. Think about who just who we think we are, abusing innocent creatures that are, in many ways, just like us. They feel loneliness, pain, and sadness. They should get better. So I'm making a stand to give them the life they deserve. Animal testing needs to stop. Now. Thank you.

I have made this speech today to show you, the people of the world, how bad poverty is in many countries around the world. Poverty is all over the world in places such as; Africa where children do not have an education, or medicine to survive terrible diseases; in Syria where over 7 million children are in poverty this winter and have to survive the freezing cold. Also, in Southern Sudan hundreds of thousands of children have been driven out of their homes, schools and communities.

Around the world around 21,000 people a day die of hunger or hunger related causes. This happens in places like Africa, Syria and Asia because people don't have enough money.

In the UK one in six children are in poverty. In the UK in 2011-2012 2.3million children in poverty that was 17% of the amount of children. In Brazil there are from 200,000 to 8 million street children. Most of the children are aged from 5 to 18 years old. A small percentage of street children only make it to eighteen. One third of people in poverty live in India. In 2012 37% of people only made \$ 1.25 a day and in the UK the typical wage is 1,301 pounds a month. This happens because of the country's economy.

Half of the worlds population lives on \$2.50 a day. More than 1 and a half billion people live in extreme poverty and only get \$1.25 a day. There are more than 1 billion children that live in poverty. 870 million people do not have a enough food to eat worldwide. More than 1 billion people don't have access to clean running water. From 2011, 19 million children did not have vaccinations due to poverty. 1 in 4 people live without electricity.

We can stop poverty in the world by giving children the right to an education and a home if we do this people are going to more likely to get a better job because they have had a good education. We can help stop poverty by having good healthcare and building health care facilities in places like India and Africa. We can also make water facilities in places like Africa where people have do not have to travel 2 miles or more a day just to retrieve some water for their family. People who live in poverty should not have to rely on charities, the government should invest in the poor and people who might be well off and donate money to people who can't even afford food to feed their family or friends.

So now you have heard about the horrendous conditions that adults and children around the world face and live in. Think about those children and adults who die everyday of hunger and not being able to afford healthcare. So now you know what being in poverty is like. I am making a stand and I hope you will help the people of the world and help me stop poverty in the UK and elsewhere. Would you be able to live in these conditions with no food or correct housing? I wouldn't, would you?

The reason I am here, is to speak about Veterans; past, present and future. I am here to speak about them because they are not getting what they are promised. They are promised free health care yet they are not getting it. They are promised disabled benefits yet they are not getting it. They are promised housing benefits yet they are not getting it. I may not be a veteran and I may not know anyone who is but there is one thing I am really passionate about. They are the ones who risk, have risked or will risk their lives for us. We need to help them like they help us.

What is a veteran? A veteran is a person who is serving or has served our country for a long time such as 3 years or over. Veterans can have several different jobs in the forces such as an engineer, troop, nurse, pilot, bomb disposal expert—and vehicle driver. Veterans risk their lives for us because they want to fight for our country.

What benefits do they get?

In the event of death, benefits may be payable to their spouse, civil partner, surviving adult dependant and eligible Children Payments and a Bereavement Grant of £37,000. Unfortunately, most veterans do not receive this payment. The disabled benefit grants for house adaptation and also grants a maximum sum of £30K but you must be at least virtually unable to walk but again, unfortunately most veterans do not receive this.

One of the reasons I am really passionate about veterans is because most of them have Post-Traumatic-Stress-Disorder (PTSD). This causes one veteran an hour to kill themselves. That is 8000 a year. An estimated 400,000 veterans suffer from Post-traumatic-stress-disorder yet 50% of those aren't even seeking help. 300,000 veterans sleep homeless on the streets just in America. If that is just in America imagine how many there are world wide.

The government made the decision to send the veterans to war. So ultimately it is their responsibility to ensure that they have the support needed to help the veterans that came back suffering from PTSD or other injuries. Unfortunately, veterans are relying more and more on charities for support such as Help For Heroes. Help for heroes is an UK Military Charity made to support veterans. Their goal is to 'support for our wounded'. Even Prince Harry addressed the issue of veterans in need:

"So many of our servicemen and women have made the ultimate sacrifice; so many lives have been lost and so many changed forever by the wounds that they have suffered in the course of their duties. For these selfless people, it is after the guns have fallen silent, the din of battle quietened, that the real fight begins – a fight that may last"

What is animal abuse?

Animal abuse is where owners hurt their dogs for no reason. In many cases, they kill them. They just steal their life for no reason and it is wrong. Owners may kick, punch, cut and injure their dogs. The dogs go through so much pain and they don't understand why. In some cases, they do it in front of the dogs mother, holding her back so she must watch no matter how hard she tries. This need to be stopped.

Could you imagine being left outside, in the cold rain to die and bleed to death? To have to sleep in a cage outside in the winter? Well, I bet you can't because we have a voice, we can make a change and our screams are heard. However, dogs are ignored, and left alone and can't make a change, but we can. We need to speak for them.

Over 8.5 million dogs, on average, are abused a year and this is too many. Not long ago, I experienced an after effect of animal abuse and it really touched me. Because the dog was abused, his eyes popped and it upset me that people said he was the ugliest dog they'd ever seen, but in fact, he was the most beautiful.

Him and 9 other dogs were packed in a small room, fed with a few scraps every few days, all 10 dogs had to fight over these scraps and as a result, they were all so skinny that their ribcages stuck out of their bodies and their eyes popped out of their heads. Fortunately, these dogs were found and taken to the RSPCA where they were well looked after, fed and had cream on their eyes every day. The dogs didn't get a new owner for a while because of their, what they said, ugly looks. My nana then adopted one of the dogs called Ruskin and everyday applied the cream to his eyes and fed him and loved him. Ruskin was very happy now although he was still scarred. As a result of the abuse, Ruskin was afraid of all dogs and many people. A few years later Ruskin became blind in one of his eyes and had it removed and stitched. Now, he was afraid of going on walks and walked into objects. He wasn't as happy now and his other eye was close to blind. Unfortunately, soon after, my nana and the vets decided it was better if Ruskin was put down and I was really upset. Although his second half of his life was better, he would always have those terrible memories. I don't know what happened to the other dogs but I hope they had a good second half of their life as Ruskin did and I hope they are okay now.

That is only one of the trillions of dog stories around the globe. Dogs are left to bleed to death, freeze to death, starve to death, and some are just injured. People neglect their dogs and leave them somewhere to die. It is wrong and needs to be changed.

Many cases happen every day, and the RSPCA is contacted at least once every 30 seconds. I don't see any reasonable explanation for dog abuse, why would you abuse or neglect an innocent pup that just tries to make you happy?

A sweet animal that doesn't know what it did wrong?

Also though, I would like to thank the RSPCA for rescuing, rehoming and caring for the animals that have been found and saved. But unfortunately, many animals are dying

silently around the world every few minutes because of our awful actions and this needs to be changed, quickly.

There is only a few ways we can help this. One being that it doesn't happen in the first place, and another is that you need to report it. You would report it if you found a human being abused and it is exactly the same with dogs. We need heroes. Our world would not be our world without our dogs, and whilst some people are abusing their dog, there is a person in the world longing for one, lonely people sat alone, that need some company. We must put a stop to this horrible way. We need heroes.

Animals all over the world are being mistreated right now in extreme physical conditions, and you have the right to do something about it, people have no right to train wild animals and put them in circuses and lock them up in cages and chain them up and whip them...

Circus animals have the right to be protected, the right to be treated fairly, the right to be in their natural environment.

Cruel acts like sinking bull hooks into elephants' skin, yanking hard, causing scars, bleeding and in the worse cases death. Trainers use whips, tight collars, muzzles, electric prods and other painful tools of the trade to force animals to perform. Animals are forced to do everything for example: eat, drink, sleep, defecate and urinate in the same cramped cages. Physical punishment has always been the standard training method to make circus animals perform. Imagine if you were there, would you do something about this to help these animals?

In more than 35 dangerous incidents since 2000, elephants have bolted from circuses, ran amok through streets, crashed into buildings, attacked members of the public, and killed and injured handlers.

On average circuses travel about 48 weeks per year, and circus animals spend an average of 26 hours in cages during the transport. Virtually 96% of a circus animals life is spent in chains or cages.

Trainers drug some animals to make them "manageable" and surgically remove the teeth and claws of others, they think animals won't hurt them but they are wrong they are wild animals and they are not meant to perform and do tricks, they are not meant to jump through fire hoops, stand on their heads or ride bicycles, people have a choice to go in the circus, animals don't and therefore we need to do something about it fast.

Most animals from the circus are bred in captivity and have spent all their life in the circus, getting mistreated wherever they stand or go, even when they mess something up in training, trainers hit them just because they did something wrong, just think if that were your child would you hit them? Would you whip them for no reason?

Trainers strike and whip the tigers during rehearsals just because they did something wrong. Tigers naturally fear fire but they are still forced to jump through fire hoops in some circuses. Thousands of tigers try to bite their trainers, but the tiger fails and gets whipped as well as using other awful weapons to make them perform and do tricks. Some trainers poach and take wild animals from the jungle and force them to perform, just because the people at the circus want to look good in front of a crowd.

Some children dream of running away to the circus, but life at the circus is not as it seems when there are animals involved... if you ever join the circus, don't join one with animals. You don't know what really is behind the act.

This is my passion, I hope that you have gained a different view to the way circus animals are abused. I appreciate your time given by listening to my views.

Dog cruelty is not fun. What have they done to hurt you? (NOTHING?) I feel so ashamed of every person who has laid hands on an innocent dog in the wrong manner. Neglect is the ongoing failure to meet a dog's basic needs and could lead to them being left hungry or dirty, without adequate shelter, supervision, medical or health care.

Physical abuse - may include hitting, punching, slapping, kicking, pinching or scratching. This is not what should be expected from their owner. Dogs are for life not for abusing, eating, attacking or fighting.

Think if you were a dog how would you want to be treated, oh wait you would not have a choice because you are not important to your owner because you are a dog.

Chinese activists recently stood up to dog meat traders and rescued 900 dogs bound for slaughter for human consumption. Many of the dogs were clearly stolen family pets, even wearing tags and collars: Huskies, German Shepherds, Poodles and the like, many extremely ill and dying from the slaveship-like conditions of the truck and cages. One woman found her lost Golden Retriever on the truck, but was told she could not take him home unless she paid off the trader. The activists were beaten and after a 50 hour standoff finally rescued all of the dogs. However, by that time some dogs had died and the activists were forced to bury them at the scene. In a raid on their homes, a huge haul of dog fighting equipment including a treadmill (used to train dogs for fighting), graphic footage of a dog fight and a well used 'break stick' (used to separate dogs) were found. In total six dogs were seized. This is just one example of some of the horrific cases I researched.

Each year 10,000 dogs die in illegal dog fighting a year which is a lot. One day I hope that all dogs will have a loving home, food, life and owner who actually loves them.

According FIFA they are fully aware of, and fully accept, its social responsibility as part of the World Cup. Then, in 2010, FIFA launched Win in Africa with Africa, an initiative to develop steady football infrastructure across Africa at a cost of \$70 million. On top of that \$12 million was invested in a number of social projects, and the 2010 FIFA World Cup Legacy Trust was founded after the World Cup with a further \$100 million to promote development in South Africa long after the World Cup and to support initiatives that use football to drive social development. It is fair to say that South Africa is still getting profit from hosting the World Cup in 2010. So they are some of the advantages of the world and the same may happen for Brazil.

FIFA believes that its social responsibility is a crucial element of the sustainable success of its events, but the World Cup can only be used as a tool or as a catalyst for change in a country if everyone involved pulls in the same direction as part of a global strategy.

This is some of people writing to stand up for the World Cup because of the World Cup that happened in Africa and I agree they are going to stand up for the World Cup.

But Brazil should have waited till their budget was strong enough for the stadium because of this Brazil may benefit from the stadiums but at the moment Brazil is losing money and the population numbers are going down slowly.

What would you do if you had to sit in a 1m by 1m cage with other humans? Why is it that dogs are made to do this for sometimes all of their lives? Instead of drinking clean, safe and transparent water would you be able to drink contaminated water that is crawling with bugs. Is this fair? The people that do this are cruel, abusive and criminals. These dogs are afraid. Afraid of the breeders. Afraid of human contact. Afraid of cages. Puppy mill dogs have no choice, they must endure pain, discomfort and lack of exercise just to get through one day. So how would you cope if you had to go through this disgusting experience everyday until the day you die. A significant proportion of dogs HERE in the UK have been born in a puppy mill. In fact, the only way to really know if any dog even your own was not from a puppy mill is to visit the breeder where you got them. I have specifically chosen puppy mills as an issue as a lot of people are not aware that these exist and I hope to raise awareness as this could help stop this animal abuse.

A puppy mill, sometimes known as a puppy farm, is a commercial dog breeding facility that is operated with an emphasis on profits over the welfare of the dogs bred, with substandard conditions of care often the norm. Many dogs are plagued with illnesses like kidney or heart disease as a result of the conditions they're kept in. Is this fair? Similar types of operations exist for other animals most commonly kept as pets or used as feed for other animals. The term can be applied to operations involving other animals commercially bred for profit, e.g. "kitty mills." The RSPCA estimates around 50,000 puppies from puppy mills are imported from Ireland every year where breeding laws are practically non-existent. A significant proportion of the UK's eight million dogs will have started life in a puppy mill. Normal dogs get treated with love, care and affection from the day they are born but Puppy mills usually house dogs in overcrowded and unsanitary conditions, without adequate veterinary care, food, water and socialisation. Puppy mill dogs do not receive adequate attention, exercise or basic grooming. Is this fair? To minimise waste cleanup, dogs are often kept in cages with wire flooring that injures their paws and legs. It is not unusual for cages to be stacked up in columns. Breeder dogs at mills might spend their entire lives outdoors, exposed to the elements, or kept inside indoor cages all their lives. Is this fair? Often, after the breeder dog has reached the age of 4 years, it is no longer needed and killed. The lineage records of puppy mill dogs are often falsified. Other puppy mill puppies are sold directly to the public, including over the Internet, through newspaper ads, and at swap meets and flea markets. Once adopted it can take up to a year for them to relax to the human touch. I had a dog. I took care of it, played with it, appreciated for what a magnificent animal he was. This is the difference between abuse and caring for a dog and all dogs deserve a loving, caring home that appreciate a dog for what they really are not the value of them. Is it fair that a small minority of people can get away with this?

Puppy mill puppies can have lots of problems but here are a few of the main ones: musculoskeletal disorders, eye problems and deafness. On top of that they can arrive in pet shops with diseases and infirmities for example : parvovirus, distemper and intestinal parasites.

To help combat this horrific act of cruelty WE all should help the law by reporting these criminals to the RSPCA because if we don't this will continue to happen day in and day out. Thousands licensed and unlicensed cases of this appalling abuse have happened meaning we need to act soon, fast and effectively to combat this crime by making the consequences greater and the benefits near to none. It becomes an offence when breeding five or more litters in one year also breeding females are restricted to one litter per year and four per lifetime. Going through these horrible traumas can ruin a dog, like it would a human.

So I am making a stand but if I get tired I will make a sit down . Okay, I am Alex Steele and I want to take a moment to share with you what I have learnt about poverty. I want to make a stand against poverty because the gap between the country's most vulnerable, Oxfam has said is getting bigger. The Government's work to reduce the deficit will hit the poor and the gap between rich and poor in the UK could become greater than it is in the South Sudan.

Millions of people are expected to be in poverty in our country in the next decade, you and I can slowly see this happening around us, take a look at the newspapers, take a look on the streets, take a look on the web. If you take a look at the statistics, Mexborough has a higher than average number of people living in rented social housing. The government should read the statistics and see that a poor education leads to poverty and it is a worldwide problem, knowing that people are on the streets and kids my age are dying because of poverty!

One person dies every 15 minutes because of lung cancer, most because of smoking cigarettes. as well as 100,000 people dying from smoking caused illnesses each year in the UK. Furthermore, the NHS spend an expensive 5 billion on treating smoking caused illnesses! As well, the average smoker spends around £3000 a year on cigarettes. It's estimated that, every year, second-hand smoke kills over 12,000 people in the UK. Exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke causes disease, disability, and death. What did these people do to deserve this? In July 2007, smoking in public places such as bars, restaurants and workplaces was made illegal to protect non-smokers from the health risks associated with passive smoking.

Pregnant smoking women are pushed by the NHS to stop smoking whilst pregnant and further on after birth. 13.5% of women are smokers at the time of delivery. Horribly, smoking doubles the chances of stillbirth. Smoking whilst pregnant can also cause illnesses to the baby when given birth and possibly in later life, as I've found out the hard way.

Neglect, malnutrition and unintentional abuse these are all forms of animal cruelty and it is unacceptable. I know that I am only 11 but I know that the amount of animal cruelty in the UK is too high. I know that the animals that are being abused each year need to be helped. It is up to you the British community to help stop animal cruelty if not today but in the future.

Animals need a loving home not to be abused. They need food and water. They need to be accepted not ignored. We need to prevent anymore animals being killed from abuse. Why are they any different to you or me? Why must we abuse them? We shouldn't. We shouldn't abuse them. We shouldn't abandon them. We shouldn't keep chickens and other animals locked up in cages not big enough for one never mind two or three.Is this fair? So why do we do it? Why do we ignore innocent animals that are being abused in the UK?

In one of the cases the RSPCA investigated there were four cats that were being ignored and left to suffer. One cat was found with a bandage around his neck. When the bandage was removed his neck was totally bald of fur and covered with dried, congealed blood. A second cat had a large open wound on one side of her body that was heavily infected. A third cat had severe cat flu with discharge coming from both eyes; she was lifeless and very underweight. A fourth cat's left hind leg was so badly damaged that the bone was exposed. His foot appeared mangled and the surrounding fur was missing. Three of the cats also tested positive for Feline Leukaemia Virus. All were very thin and had gum disease. The man admitted he didn't know how many cats he had and hadn't taken any of them to a vet. He considered Vaseline and bandages sufficient treatment. It was his conscious choice to ignore the four cats' severe and obvious suffering. An inspector from the RSPCA said, "the cats in this case had the worst untreated injuries

she had ever seen on a domestic pet." Sadly, the cats had to be put down on the advice of the vet. Do you think the cats deserved to live like that? I don't.

So I can stand here and tell you all this and you can just listen. Or we can do something about it. You, me and the British community can work together for the good of all animals. We have to try for all the poor animals that are living under the roof of abuse and that are dying each year. It is unfair. We can stop it we just have to work together. So please help the animals that are being abused help the animals that are under neglect because we need to stop animal abuse and it needs to stop soon. Will you help stop animal abuse and help all the innocent animals in the world suffering from animal cruelty?

This is a true story.

Imagine this. This final story is quite sad since the guinea pig has recently passed away. Her story is a very horrible one, since Sue and Winston had to actually come and rescue the guinea pigs themselves. They found the guinea pigs abandoned in a small, freezing, black room. In two very small cages there were twenty-six pregnant female and twenty-three male guinea pigs. One of these guinea pigs called Brave gave birth to a daughter called Sasha. Her name is Brave because she was so courageous in spite of the terrible way her owners treated her. This is a true story.

Can you believe that some guinea pigs actually get fed to snakes dead or alive? Should the owners really do all this? Is this fair?

On the ninth of August 2014 it was official that over one-thousand guinea pigs have been rescued and hundreds have been rehomed.

Every year over 16,000 innocent dogs die, due to illegal dog fighting. Just one of many horrendous blood sports. Dog fighting is generally illegal, however, many people violate this law and carry on torturing dogs for entertainment and money. I feel so strongly and passionately about stopping this cruelty that I feel like I should make a stand!

In this horrible industry, two dogs, of a specific breed, are locked in a fighting pit, which can be a hole in the ground surrounded by a 3 foot fence made of plywood or wire. They are then forced to fight viciously for hours on end until one of the dogs is dead or is physically exhausted and cannot go on. Is it fair to do this to innocent dogs? Open wounds, broken bones and death. These are all common things in an illegal dog fight. This needs to stop!

Even though the actual sport is shocking and inhumane, the dark truth behind the aggressive fighting still remains a gruesome certainty. Fighting dogs are pushed to their physical and mental barriers in training for fights. They are forced to run for hours on end on treadmills that are usually homemade like slat mills, but some are tethered to mechanical ones. How can it be fair to do this to them? Owners also use something called a spring pole. It is made from a tall pole or sturdy tree branch with a rope dangling from it with some sort of toy, knotted rope, tyre or other materials they can bite onto. Dogs then have to jump and hold onto the toys to strengthen and improve the endurance of their teeth, neck and jaw. This can result in damaged gums and teeth, causing great pain. Owners usually treat their animals medically at home, when they are injured, so they do not get found out by police. They give them antibiotics, steroids, and iron supplements. Not taking fighting dogs to have professional veterinary care can lead to internal injuries left uncared for which can sometimes lead to death. Before a 'match' dogs are washed under a referee's supervision before a fight, in case they have any poison on their coat. This is a common method of cheating in illegal dog fighting and can sometimes be an irritant or even deadly to the dogs fur. Dog fighters keep track of which dog and bloodline are winning through publications, usually magazines. These are actually illegal in the U.S, but are still common. Worst of all fighting dogs are chained, taunted and starved to trigger intense survival instincts and boost aggression. How could a human do this? This needs to stop!

Even though dog fighters make money, it is at the expense and health of innocent dogs, who just want affection and to be man's best friend. Me and my family got a wonderful dog around my 9th birthday, called Woody. He is caring and protective, I could never imagine forcing him to fight! How can humans do this to beautiful creatures?

The FA in their opening remarks accepted that Luis Suarez was not racist.

Sheffield United player Chedwyn Evans was accused of raping a 19-year-old girl. Evans was convicted on 20 April 2012 and was sentenced to five years imprisonment but he only completed half of his sentence. Do you thinks this is a long enough sentence for someone who is a role model to young kids? He was eligible for release after serving half of that sentence. He was released on 17 October 2014. Although he remains on the Violent and Sex Offender Register, indefinitely.

West Bromwich were fighting relegation from the top flight, their Czech striker Roman Bednar was apparently caught up in a News of the World sting. The newspaper released photos of the striker apparently handing over £420 to a man in a car to pay for cocaine and cannabis. As the story leaked, his club immediately suspended the player pending further investigation. The player was cautioned by West Midlands police and was granted permission to return to action from the beginning of the 09/10 season by the Football Association following his suspension. I think this is horrible, horrifying and disgusting.

My speech has highlighted that there are footballers out there in the top league of football that are not good role models. I want all the countries to make a contract saying that if a footballer does a criminal offence they would complete their sentence and then they couldn't play football again as a paid job.

Today, I am going to tell you about something I am not happy about. Lots of innocent animals and creatures are being treated poorly by people just like you and me. Most people don't have a reason to be doing this, and some.....just think it is funny! Animals are just like us humans, they eat, sleep and even help people who desperately need it.

Over the past few years, millions and millions of animals have been left, starved and trapped in their own homes. 64.5% of dogs are involved in this abuse. You could understand if a dog has to be put to sleep because it was ill or had hurt someone. But leaving your pet dog trapped inside, or in a cage, with rubbish everywhere and no food and water is cruel. Some people even chain their dogs outside, they don't feed them or give them water; they leave them outside in the rain to starve. People also just kill animals for their fur, skin and bones to make coats, rugs and medicines.

There are many types of animal abuse. Dog fighting is a very common one. People or their 'owners' use their dogs, put them in pits, barns, alleyways, old buildings, garages and a lot of hidden away places, to fight. The dogs fight and fight until one dog can't go on anymore because it's hurt, passed away during the fight or run away. What football team do you think are the best? Probably the football fanatics will choose either Barcelona or Real Madrid. Probably these football fanatics will choose the best players in these teams, which I believe are Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi.

Cristiano Ronaldo is "beyond perfection" and a "born footballer" who plays for the Spanish team, Real Madrid. You may think that practically all footballers are loaded, but this particular footballer earns mind-blowing amounts.

Premiership footballers earn an average of £676,000 per year, according to a survey conducted by 'The Independent and the Professional Footballers' Association'.

That figure, which equates to £13,000 per week, typically rises by between 60% and 100% when performance-related bonuses are taken into account. Strikers have the highest average annual salary, with £806,000, while midfielders earn about £754,000. Defenders earn £653,000 on average and Premiership goalkeepers make £533,000.

But Cristiano Ronaldo made €17 million in 2014. Ronaldo should be paid but not to the extent of millions. On the other hand, the Argentinian Lionel Messi earns a whopping €20 million-also according to 2014- a massive €3 million more than the Portuguese footballer.

Furthermore, if you're thinking that Ronaldo and Messi earn a lot, well there are other footballers who earn near enough the same wage, for example: Wayne Rooney, the Manchester United Striker, earns a colossal 18.1 million US Dollars (USD). This is far too much as he is not exactly the best player of this time.

If an average midfielder from the Barclays Premier League earns £806,000 you would expect a firefighter to earn a wage near that mark, considering the fact that they risk their lives. The answer is no, and the wage is not even close. On average, a regular firefighter would earn about £21,000 a year, for a trainee .This rises to around £28,500 once qualified and passed as competent after probation. Crew managers can earn up to £31,500 a year, and station managers can earn between £36,500 and £40,500 a year. Retained firefighters are paid a fee, which can be between £2,100 and £2,800 a year.

Personally, that kind of wage to me is nothing in comparison because firefighters have to risk their lives to go into buildings and treacherous conditions to save lives. A firefighter experiences temperatures which can cause serious burns and in the worst cases can cause cancer or even loss of life.

Structural firefighting gear is recommended by the NFPA to be rated at a minimum of a TPP rating of 35. A good rule of thumb for translating a TPP rating into time in heat is to cut your TPP rating in half, this is the number of seconds a firefighter has in 1,000 degrees. This means that they have about 18 seconds to in a room of 1,000. An average temperature that firefighters withstand in a structure fire is usually between 400 and 800 degrees. With this heat resistance is also a big limitation. Though, they have protection from most heat transfer, they have little to no protection from steam. This penetrates right into the suit, and causes very painful burns.

I cannot imagine how a firefighter gets paid hardly anything in comparison to footballers. In my mind, all footballers do is just kick a ball across a pitch and get attention from the public. Most footballers get over £1million in the UK which really could be spent on something else.

The same story continues with the average wage of residents in the UK. In 2011, the average household net-adjusted disposable income was 26,552, while the average annual salary was £21,326. In April 2012, average gross weekly earnings for full-time employees were £506, an increase of 1.5% percent from £498 in 2011. This brought the average full-time wage to £26,500.

Even the police get paid between forces but the typical starting salary for police constables in England, Wales and Northern Ireland is £23,317 and £25,962 after initial training. In Scotland it's slightly higher, starting at £23,493 and rising to £26,223 after completing the initial training period. The range of typical salaries after several years' experience is £36,519 to £41,040 for sergeant; £46,788 to £50,751 for inspector; and £51,789 to £53,919 for chief inspector.London weighting up to around £6,500 and additional competency-related threshold payments are available for all ranks.

Policeman and policewomen are there to enforce the law and keep the world safe but again the footballer wage takes over.

There are around 45,000 hospital consultants who are paid between £74,504 a year and £100,000 a year. Salaries for the UK's 42,000 GPs vary from an average of £103,000 a year for partners in practices to anything between £53,781 and £81,158 for GPs employed by Primary Care Trusts. Knowing the fact that doctors save lives, which is critical, obviously, in my opinion, a doctor should be paid buckets upon buckets of money, because footballers have done nothing for us except giving the world entertainment.

If an average English person gets paid £26,500, footballers should earn that much, if not a smaller amount. Even a maximum average wage for a GP Doctor is £103,000 - that is nothing compared to footballers' wage.

Think about Wayne Rooney, an English footballer who plays for Manchester United earns 50p a second. In spite of the fact he is not regarded as the best footballer in the world he still earns unimaginable amounts.

This suggests that everyone within football gets a fair chance at a job. The FA state that their race equality work is focused on one ethos: using the positive power of football to create equal opportunities – for everyone and anyone and to enjoy the world's greatest game. Yet there are only two black managers in the Premier League.

Jeffrey Webb, the Concacaf president and Fifa vice-president, said the lack of black and ethnic minority figures in the dugout and the boardroom was overt but that no one wanted to deal with the problem.

The head of Fifa's anti-racism task force has said that discrimination in English football is "right in front of your face"!

FARE (Football Against Racism in Europe) witnessed that there has been between 300 and 500 Croatian fans chanting monkey noises, which prompted UEFA to investigate.

The Croatian Football Federation has been fined 80,000 euros (£65,000) after fans directed racist abuse at Italy striker Mario Balotelli.

A photographer reportedly saw a steward retrieving a banana and heard monkey chants directed at Manchester City forward Mario Balotelli.

Croatia have three days to appeal against Uefa's punishment.

A Uefa statement said: "The Croatian Football Federation (HNS) has been fined 80,000 euros for the setting-off and throwing of fireworks, and the improper conduct of supporters (racist chants, racist symbols) at the Uefa Euro 2012 Group C match against Italy in Poznan on Thursday, 14 June.

In a statement it said: "The Croatian Football Federation distances itself from all deviant behaviour of the part of the fans during the final tournament of Uefa Euro 2012 and strongly condemns it."

Football is the sport of England with over 10 leagues and around 24 teams in each league. I am making a stand today to argue that racism should be stopped.

I am making a stand today to make it clear that racism in all sports is not acceptable.

Today I will be talking to you about animal abuse and neglect. Every day hundreds of cats, dogs and other animals either die or are rescued by the RSPCA or other charities. These animals die or are rescued for one specific reason, because they are abused and neglected.

I would like to make a stand against this as many animals are dying, they are losing their lives due to neglect and abuse. If you were an animal being abused and neglected, how would you feel? If you were left all alone without food or water, how would you feel? If you were the animal being neglected would you prefer your owners love and affection rather than being abused and neglected? This is why I am making a stand against animal abuse.

An example of animal neglect is puppy mills. The female dog is often kept in poor conditions and is used like a breeding machine, she will produce litter after litter, not being able to wean her puppies correctly. The puppies bred there are neglected and are plagued with illnesses and diseases. This is because the breeders don't care for the dogs that they are breeding. All they want is the money for breeding them, then the dogs new owner will have to buy medicines for the dog and pay expensive treatments to cure the dog from its plague brought to it by the puppy mill. Unfortunately, it is not just the puppies in the puppy mills that have been abused and neglected.

People kill greyhounds they have bought because they are not a high enough standard for the owner because they don't have the racing potential the owner wants or because the greyhound is injured, because of this the owner would kill the greyhound. One final example of abuse for greyhounds is that when they can no longer run their owner abandons them.

One last example of animal neglect is when you leave your animal with little water and little food and leave it chained up to starve to death. The fine for animal cruelty can be up to £20,000 or 6 months in prison. If you don't want to pay this bill, don't neglect or abuse your animal. The amount of people who have been fined or imprisoned for animal cruelty has not been recorded. So how do the government know how many people have been imprisoned and fined? According to the RSPCA's cruelty records for 2006 revealed an 8% increase in rescues and collections from the previous year, an 11% increase in the number of complaints investigated but an 8% reduction in convictions.

The hens that lay eggs for us, battery hens, they are caged up, to lay eggs all day long. They are kept in a factory in poor conditions. The poor conditions they are kept in include cramped cages, the cages are that small that the hens cannot spread their wings without hitting another chicken. They are most likely to never see sunlight and to go outdoors and be free. The hens in these factories will never be like the hens which are energetic and lay eggs out in the open as free range.

This is wrong and I want to make a stand against animal cruelty.

I believe that animal cruelty should not happen because it is cruel, nasty and terrible behaviour. Think of this; on average every 30 seconds someone in England and Wales dials the RSPCA's 24 hour cruelty line for help. In 2013 they received 1,327,849 phone calls. The RSPCA have approximately 267 full time (46 part time) RSPCA inspectors, 18 trainee inspectors, 55 full time (3 part time) animal welfare officers and 77 full time (6 part time) animal collection officers (ACOs) working to prevent cruelty and promote kindness to animals in England and Wales.

Their inspectors now investigate more than 150,000 complaints of cruelty and neglect every year. In 2007, the Animal Welfare Act became law in England, shortly after it was implemented in Wales. Described as the single most important piece of animal welfare legislation. They have a network of 166 RSPCA branches around England and Wales, and they work with many animal welfare organisations abroad through their international team.

Their four RSPCA animal hospitals and five clinics treat pets in need of preventative medicine or welfare treatments belonging to members of the public who can't afford private veterinary fees. (they also have 37 clinics and 3 mobile clinics run by their branches.) Their 16 regional animal centres across England and Wales help people adopt pets and rehome more animals than any other organisation. (They also have 40 animal centres run by their branches.) They have four specialist RSPCA wildlife centres in England.

The RSPCA also works to improve the lives of millions of farm, laboratory and wild animals. More than 900 million farm animals are reared every year in the UK. Around 4 million scientific procedures are carried out using animals in research establishments in the UK each year. For nearly 100 years, the Act places a legal obligation on owners and keepers of animals to care for them properly.

What is a homeless person? A homeless person's plight is caused by poverty and some of the main causes of homelessness include relationship breakdown and domestic violence, mental or physical health problems. About a quarter of people who are homeless have been in local authority care, four in ten rough sleepers in London have spent time in prison and three % of rough sleeping and single homeless people are British ex-service personnel. Also, people losing their jobs affects their lifestyle because they then can't provide for themselves and they have no money so they won't be able to pay bills or rent which then leads to them getting kicked out of their home. 1 in 6 foster children up to the age of 21 also have the risk of becoming homeless.

I believe that everyone has the right to a decent standard of living with food, clothing, housing, medical care and security. Give someone your smiles even if it's the only sunshine they see all day, it may not change the whole world but it will make a difference in their world. In the course of a year, the estimated odds for experiencing homelessness for an adult are 1 in 10.

I am going to tell you a story. One day me and my mum were walking towards Primark when a women asked my mum to change two ten pence pieces into a twenty pence because she had been trying to get a bed for the night and she had spent three pounds on the phone trying to get one. I wonder if they are thinking, 'Am I being punished? Is it for something I have done? Is it because I don't fit in? Or is it because I don't belong here in this world?' Would you like to live as homeless people? Have you ever felt invisible?

Homeless people rely on the generosity and compassion of strangers. They live in a world that we do not understand or comprehend. What may seem as trash or garbage, they see as food, water or a warm coat. What we don't appreciate a homeless person will. When we are in our warm, cosy houses there are 4 in 10 people living in a car or in another place that is not intended for human habitat. Lack of affordable housing and long waiting lists for assisted housing, means that men and women and their children are forced to chose between abuse at home and life on the streets. Nevertheless, these problems are being solved by the big hearted, kind, caring people who are putting shelters up for the homeless for free. However, I believe that there are still people suffering out in the streets.

While you and I would be embarrassed to be found digging through trash for food, warm clothing or any basic need they shed their embarrassment and do what they need to do to make it through another day. A professor and a Cornell University graduate student says that during the 13 seasons from 1991 through to 2004, white referees called fouls at a greater rate against black players than against white players.

For example, in the Barclays Premier League in a match between Liverpool and Manchester United in 2010 the footballer Luis Suarez was said to make racist comments towards Patrice Evra. Suarez was charged £40,000 and banned for 8 games. I do not agree that the punishment was not enough. Suarez earns almost £200,000 pounds a week, £40,000 pounds will not affect him at all. This match was televised, many people saw this happen.

In a football match between Barcelona and Villarreal, the player Dani Alves had a banana thrown at him, comparing him to a monkey. Alves picked up the banana and ate it to say that he wasn't bothered. Alves played better after the incident and at the end of the match he said that the banana gave him energy. After the game other players started to take pictures of themselves eating bananas to make a stand, they did not agree with what happened. It then started quite a big thing around the world. A bad thing is that footballers are role models. People look up to them and want to be like them! Do you think they should be? Luis Suarez has won a lot of awards. In April 2014, he won the PFA Players, Player of the Year award, becoming the first non European to win the award, and the FWA Footballer of the Year. He won the Premier League's top scorer with 31 goals, he won the Premier League Golden Boot, and shared the European Golden Shoe with Cristiano Ronaldo.

This is a quote from a man who made the whole world laugh, Robin Williams. He starred in many famous films, for example, Jumanji, Mrs Doubtfire, Hook, and so many more. However, behind the funnyman Robin Williams was deeply depressed. He suffered from years of depression, as this took its toll, he committed suicide in his home on August 11th 2014. His death caused great sadness and broke many people's hearts. Nobody realised how depressed Robin was. "You know that place between sleep and awake, that place where you're still remember dreaming? That's where I'll always love you Peter Pan. That's where I'll be waiting." Tinkerbell says this to Peter Pan (played by Robin) in Hook and I think it perfectly describes how Robin Williams will be remembered.

Have you noticed that when we know people have a mental illness, we judge them. Why? It's not their fault. I bet you know somebody with an illness. Whether it be mental or physical. I would like you to think to yourself for a minute what it would be like to have a mental illness. What would it be like to have people judging you? What would it be like for you to be told how to live your life?

Did you know that 20% of adults are affected by a mental disorder? Anxiety effects 14% of adults and 6% suffer from depression.

In the UK the NHS have been told they could save more than £50 million a year by shifting the focus. It has been said that the NHS save £989 every time a person gets treated with therapy rather than going to hospital. The cuts have had an impact on next year's budgets as mental health trusts have been asked to save 20% more for the upcoming year.

'Rethink' said mental health accounted for 23% of the disease burden in England but received only 13% of the health budget.

As a result of this, in November, a 16-year-old girl from Devon spent two nights in a police cell as no psychiatric bed was available. She isn't the only one either. Vulnerable British children are locked in prison as medical facilities don't have the correct help. This is proof that in the future, this is going to affect many peoples lives, as these people will not know they have a mental illness and won't receive the help they need or the support they want. The population is constantly growing but long term people who need the support such as mental health, won't get the support they need. If we were to receive help we could possibly slow the death rate. As we can support people with depression, and stop suicide.

If only the services would help, it would give us a ray of sunlight, hope and happiness instead of the great dark glooming cloud that is hanging over us and close to dropping.

Mental Illness is treated like a shameful thing. In many places including England nobody talks about it, nobody tries or listens. It's like an unwritten law, that we don't talk about illnesses and people aren't getting heard.

I may be one person, but for every one person that makes a stand, every one person who hears, for everybody who takes three minutes of courage to stand and talk about things they are passionate about it's another way for people to hear. To know and see.

Would you like to be treated unkindly?

I have 11 animals in my home: four dogs, three chickens, two rabbits, one tortoise and a fish. All of my animals in my home have a name, all of my animals give my family happiness and joy; they make us laugh, they are funny and helpful but also fun to play with.

There are horror stories out there that are true, that countless animals are treated badly, not cared for, not loved, not appreciated. My mum told me someone went into her best friends garden and stole their dog. If you watch the T.V. and read the newspapers you will find out for yourselves how many dogs have been stolen everyday. Thieves make lots of money for stealing your dogs or your pets. Do you know why? Its because they steal them then sell them.

RSPCA inspectors now investigate more than 150,000 complaints every year. They have found new homes for 55,323 animals, the UK pet populations in 2013 was estimated at 8.5 million cats and 8.5 million dogs. On average 1 in 2 households own a pet with around 22 million pets owned. More than 50% of the fur in the United States comes from China, where there are no penalties for abusing animals which are raised in unbearably cramped and run-down cages from farms. Each year, thousands of young and healthy greyhounds are killed because of their lack of racing potential or they have been injured while racing and are no longer competitive. The RSPCA bring rays of sunshine into the darkness of cruelty.

I believe that animals have the right for happiness and it is up to us to ensure that happens.

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen. I am Azriel and in this speech I will be making a stand against animal testing, and how its cruelty must be stopped.

I believe animals should not be tested on. They're innocent. Just like us, they feel pain and fear and sadness. Their own natural instincts are to be free and to protect their own lives, not to be locked in a small cage inside a laboratory. Animals every year are tested on: animals may legally be poisoned; deprived of food, water or sleep; subjected to psychological distress; they are deliberately infected with diseases; surgically mutilated; and electrocuted and brutally killed so that we don't suffer. They have to suffer. We do this to them in hope of our own survival. This happens to millions of animals every year.

Research on living animals has been practiced since at least 500 BC, and about 80% of animal tests that take place today are for research and drug development. Think about it. The bitter thought that some medicine you could have taken will have involved animal testing! Innocent creatures will have been examined, tested upon and eventually killed so people will be able to use these new drugs to help them with their everyday lives, illnesses and even save their lives.

Some people argue that animal testing can help and has helped save people's lives. They believe without it we wouldn't know if a product is safe to use or not. The only other way to tell if they would be safe to use is to test them on ourselves. For example, if scientists test a new drug that they think will cure a disease or sickness they can test it on animals to see if their theory is right, and if so, they can use it on humans. People will be able to use these new drugs to help them with their everyday lives, illnesses and even save their lives.

However, many people, like me, believe that animal testing is cruel and inhumane. They also argue that there are other alternative methods to animal testing, and that animals are so different from human beings that research on animals often yields irrelevant results. So why should we still use animal testing when this can be avoided?

On the 21st of June, David Dane talked about how animal testing saved his parents:

'Both my parents are cancer sufferers and both have had their lives extended and their quality of life enhanced by therapies and treatments that were brought into being by animal research.'

In the past year animal research has been key to many medical breakthroughs including: the Gila monster's (South American lizard) venom is a key ingredient in Lixisenatide, a new treatment for diabetes

And due to animal testing, we have new toiletry products and cleaning solutions.

From recent studies, I have found out that an estimated 26 million animals are used every year in the United States and the UK for scientific and commercial testing; 84% of those animals are rodents; 12% of them are fish and reptiles; large mammals take up 2.1%; small mammals are 1.4% of the figure; 0.4% dogs and cats; and 0.1% are primates.

Although scientists still use animal testing as a tool, animals tend to have a different biological system to us, meaning that a solution may cure a disease on a primate, yet have different effects on a human. This must be stopped. Animal testing is inaccurate

science, it has wasted resources, delayed medical progress and even dangerously derailed our understanding of diseases. This must be stopped. We have delayed our understanding of polio transmission, heart disease and diabetes because we studied these diseases on different species. We cannot afford for anymore of this to happen. This must be stopped.

Continuing on what I have found on PETA.org, many studies have shown that animal tests fail to predict reactions in humans accurately, and they sometimes get it right less than 25 per cent of the time. There is also a serious debate within the scientific community about the value of information obtained from various animal tests. This raises doubts about the scientific validity of applying the results from research on animals to humans.

Thankfully, people are now beginning to understand how torturous and horrible animal testing really is and that without it, animals across the globe can live better lives, free and out in the open. I believe that this should stop and that it can. If enough effort and enough support is put forward to getting rid of animal testing then it can be gone for good. The voices of many creatures will be saved.

I know this because one of my classmates was bullied and they thought that no one liked them but me and my friend actually felt sorry for them because the bully didn't like them because of who they really were.

In this speech I am making a stand against child abuse. I think that this is a terrible thing that goes on in the world.

There are many different types of child abuse but first I am going to provide you a few facts about this. Every single day approximately five children die due to child abuse. One out of three girls and one out of five boys will be sexually abused before they reach the age of 18. 3.6 million cases of child abuse are reported each year in the U.S. Most children become victims of abuse and neglect at 18 months or younger. Younger children are more vulnerable.

Child neglect is a common type of child abuse. It is a pattern of failing to provide for a child's basic needs. It may be a result of an attempt to harm a child but not always, it can also result from severe discipline. One in 18 people have been physically abused. The NSPCC have responded to over 9 thousand contacts about physical abuse last year. Over 6600 people have needed protection from child abuse just this last year.
