Introduction

One of XP's year 7 expeditions was called 'All together now' and looked at what makes a successful community.

Students focused on reading Seedfolks by Paul Fleishman and delved into the changing community within the book and the different characters. In Crew students read The Giver by Louis Lowry which gave an alternative view of a community.

As part of the expedition students walked around the school's community noting the successful and unsuccessful elements of it and then discussing the successful elements of Doncaster and what makes it this way.

Students looked at examples of successful communities and unsuccessful communities and how they had come together to make it more successful. Students then produced a written reflection on the answer to the guiding question - what makes a success community? They also produced a watercolour painting of an aspect of what they felt makes a successful community.

This booklet is a collection of the artwork students produced along with an extract from their written reflection.


"I believe what makes a successful community are the people in it and that everyone is entitled to their own opinion and that they are able to make a good impact on the community that can fit to anyone's needs."
