

Welcome from Head of Year 7 Mr Perkins

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
- 29 years at St. Edmunds, 24 as a Head of Year!

Values and expectations... bumps in the road

- Behaviour not meeting our expectations: Redirection -> Warning -> Removal from lesson -> Faculty detention
- Three warnings in any 5 days = after school detention.
- Continued poor classroom behaviour will result in further intervention from curriculum leaders.
- Consistent detentions or warnings results in a Head of Year Behaviour Hearing to set targets.
