SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

WHAT IS THE SALT AND ICE CHALLENGE?

A dangerous online trend is resurfacing where children put salt on their skin and press ice on top of it for as long as possible. This creates a chemical reaction, rapidly lowering the temperature and causing cryogenic (cold) burns, similar to frostbite. A particular danger of this challenge is that the extreme cold from the ice and salt mixture numbs the skin, masking the pain and making it difficult for the person to realise the extent of the damage they are causing. By the time they feel pain, significant tissue damage has often already occurred. The 'Salt and Ice Challenge' can cause second or third degree burns that may require skin grafts as well as leaving permanent scars.

TREATMENT

Immediate First Aid Advice

- Cool the affected area under lukewarm running water for at least 10 minutes.
- Do not apply ice, creams, or fluffy dressings.
- Cover with clean cling film or smooth plastic.
- Seek medical attention for deep, blistered, or extensive burns.


