

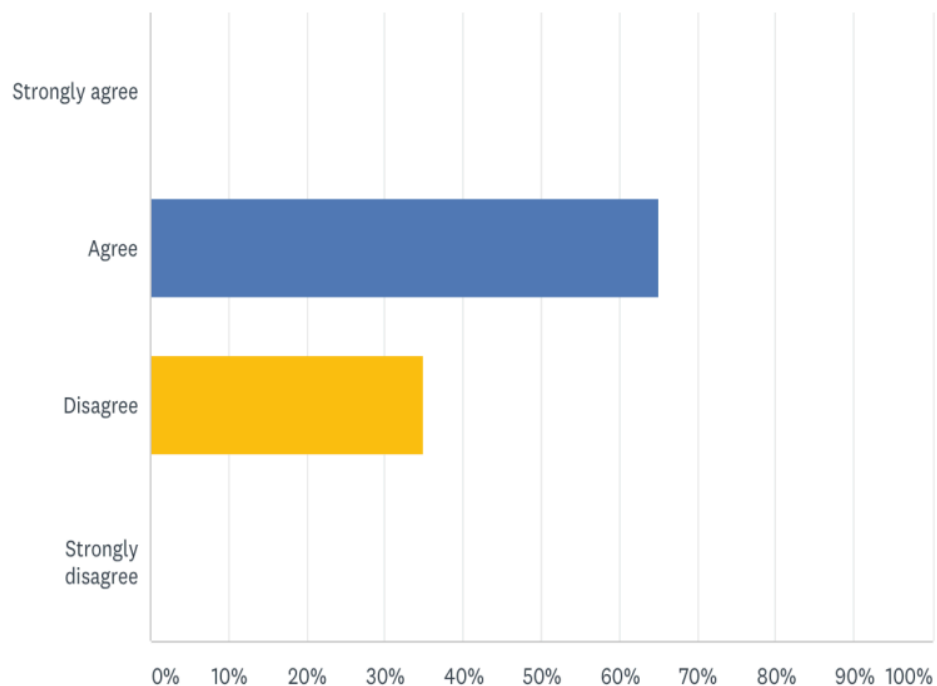

Progress to date:

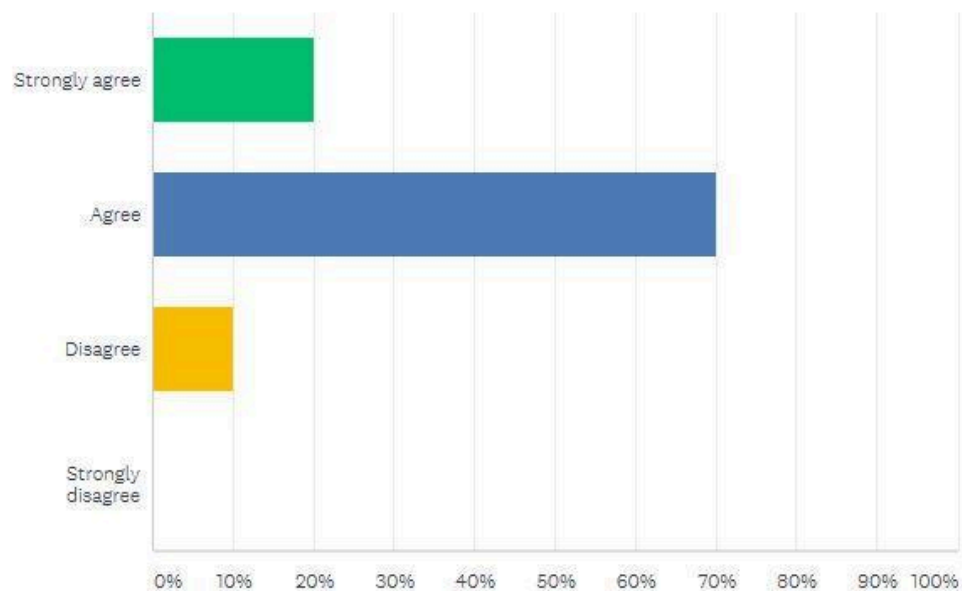
- ✓ Staff with specific responsibility for “Student Voice’ so students have the opportunity to voice any peer concerns to ensure they play an active role in driving improvement across the Centre
- ✓ Enhancement of Key worker provision to increase contact time with students, more opportunities to action any concerns / issues by students
- ✓ Personalised learning is enhanced through continued staff professional development and resource audit

- ✓ Regular SNAP, PASS and Bounce Together assessments of students (from termly to half termly) to highlight any concerns the student are having with regarding to friendships with peers, self esteem, anxiety etc.
- ✓ Development of school reward system to ensure all students are acknowledged and feel valued for improvements in behaviour, attendance and progress

Progress to date:

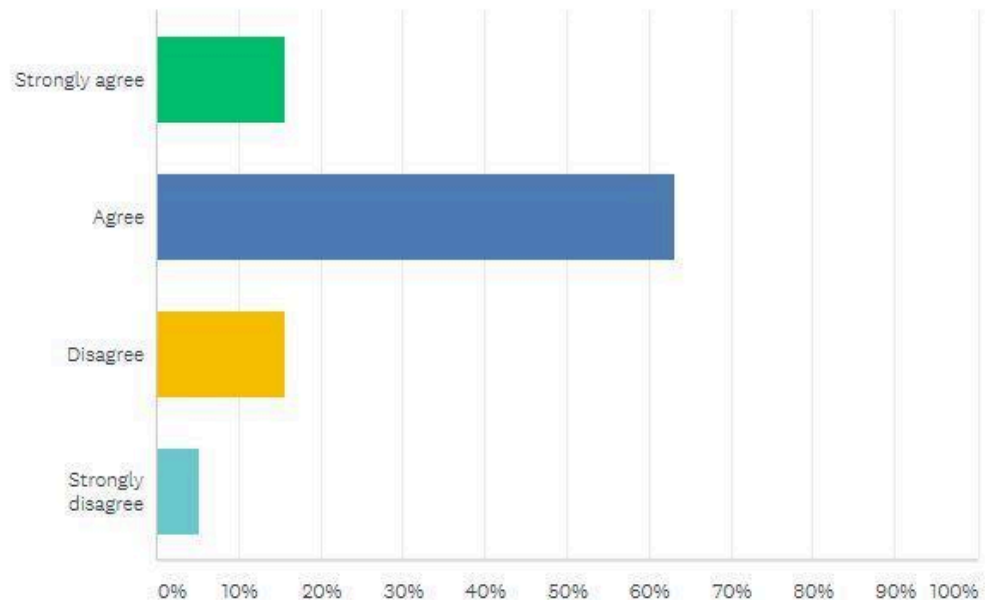
- ✓ Investigate the viability of Behaviour Watch as a tool to effectively record behaviour incidents, track and identify trends over time and patterns between cohorts of students
- ✓ Training secured for 3 existing members of staff involved with attendance, behaviour and counselling to complete the Designated Safeguarding Officer qualification

- ✓ Introduction of a quiet, engaging and relaxing social area for more vulnerable students to access at breaks and lunches away from other peers if they wish
- ✓ Weekly wellbeing and progress meetings with all staff enables any concerns to be quickly and effectively managed and ensures immediate intervention with parents informed of progress or concerns by tutors and key workers
- ✓ The curriculum has programmes in place which tackle issues and prejudices while seeking to promote equality and diversity in teaching and learning making the Beacon Centre a safe environment for students to attend

Question 3

The school helps me to be healthy

Progress to date:

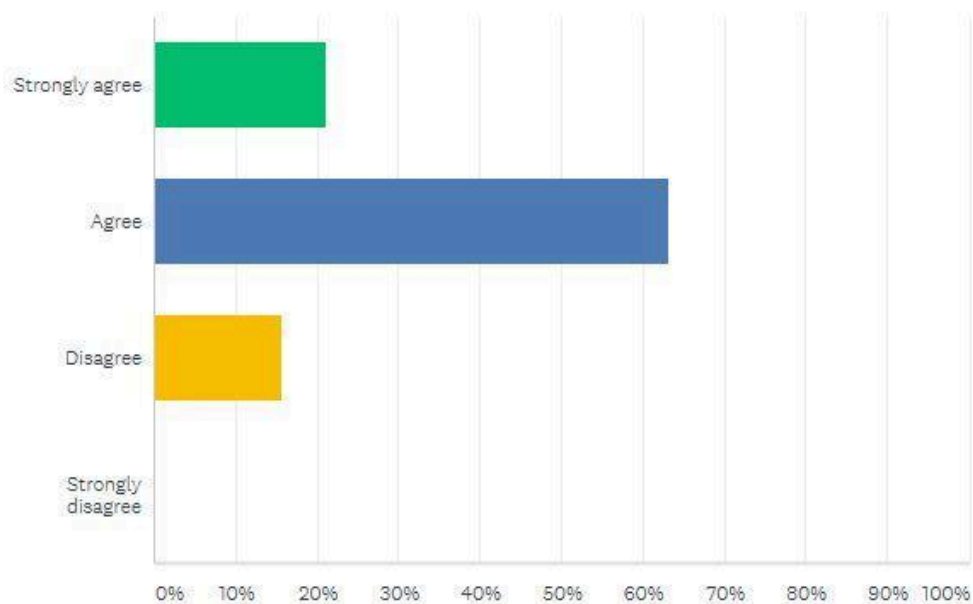
- ✓ 2 members of staff are now full trained to lead smoking cessation sessions and offer a range of solutions to students who are seeking to quit smoking

- ✓ Close collaboration with catering staff to ensure school meals are regularly reviewed and are appealing to students whilst following government guidelines
- ✓ Extensive ongoing CPD training for staff and age / gender appropriate sessions offered to students regarding Child Sexual Exploitation, sexual health and maintaining healthy relationships
- ✓ “Staying Safe” is a core behaviour for learning theme and is evident across the curriculum in subjects such as PSHRE, Citizenship, Ologies, Home Cooking, PE, ICT and English
- ✓ Anti bullying week and Mental Health initiatives led by School Counsellor across the Centre

Question 4

Staff help me to manage my behaviour

Answered: 19 Skipped: 1



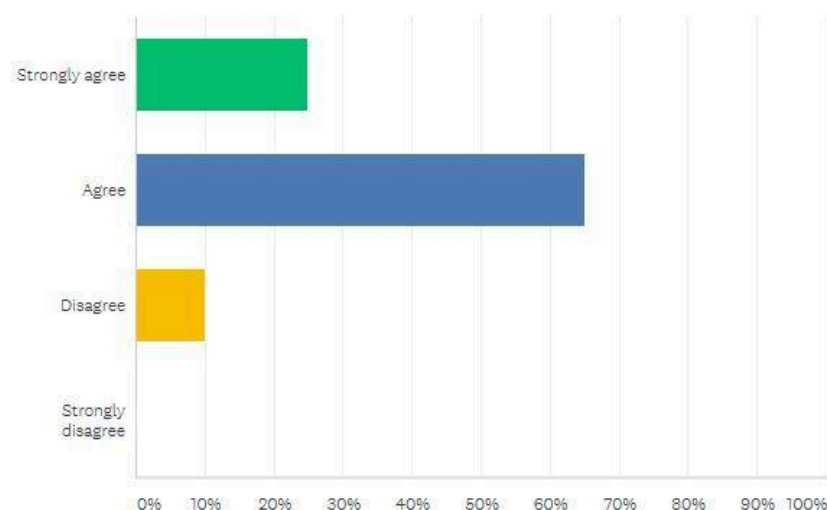
Progress to date:

- ✓ Personalised and bespoke Behaviour Management pathway is now a core element of the online learning curriculum
- ✓ Termly SNAP assessments by key workers to demonstrate progress made in behaviour and identify any concerns by staff which can then be addressed and strategies implemented
- ✓ Regular CPD for staff with de-escalating challenging behaviours as a focus, collaborative work by SMT with PRU's within the North East to ensure good practices are shared
- ✓ Rigorous systems in place when supply staff are required to ensure only those staff with adequate and appropriate experience are deployed
- ✓ Increase engagement of parents in a supportive way in the implementation of Early Help plans
- ✓ Working Group established to regularly review and update the Behaviour Policy thereby ensuring staff, students and parents are aware of their roles and responsibilities

Question 5

My school helps me to prepare for the future

Progress to date:

- ✓ Personalised Careers programme for students through the online learning platform (Ed Lounge) and North East partnerships
- ✓ Student placements from local Universities to raise aspirations
- ✓ Increased number of students in Yr. 10 and some in Yr 9, accessing Work Related Learning programmes in construction, child care, health and beauty and mechanics
- ✓ Close collaboration with Careers advice team to ensure students are aware of the next steps in their education and options offered
- ✓ Bespoke integration programme for students returning to mainstream education
