Important Reminders

<u>Uniform</u> - Children should be dressed in appropriate uniform and wear dark coloured shoes or black trainers. Hair styles should also be appropriate for school, with no tramlines. Small gold or silver stud earrings and a watch are the only items of jewellery allowed in school. No bangles or bands please! Stamper tattoos and nail varnish should also be removed before coming to school.

<u>Opening times</u> - Children should not be in the yard before 8.35am, but must be ready to enter the school when the first bell rings at 8.50am.
