# **COVID** Update

This week has seen 3 of our classes, in Year 1 and Year 6, sent home to self isolate, following the positive test result of an adult and a child. We really appreciated the fast response from parents/carers collecting their child from school. You will understand that we don't always receive the test results before the start of the school day.

We take advice from the local authority Public Health support team, before any decisions are made and we also check the dates of the self isolation period.

If anyone in your household has symptoms and goes for a test, everyone within that household must self isolate until the result comes back.

If your child goes for a test, please inform us immediately and also let us know the result as soon as you get it.
